

May 21, 2016

Location: Bellaire Civic Center, 7008 South Rice Avenue, Bellaire, Texas

Attendees: Phil Booth, David Jaschke, Clair Jaschke, Jack Adair, Mike Epstein, Ryan Eisworth, Mike King, Steve Bridgham

Call to Order: By President Phil Booth at 1:06 PM following the conclusion of the May General Meeting. We had a good meeting today with Dave Hamilton. We also have our meeting set up for June with Lee Hutchinson of ARSTechnica.

Monthly Reports

Secretary - Jack Adair: The minutes of the April 2016 BOD meeting were approved unanimously

Treasurer's Report - Clair Jaschke: Clair reported that our checking account balance as of the end of April 2016 was \$2,858.13. Our savings account balance was \$10,003.30, for total cash on hand of \$12,861.43. All bills have been paid and all monies have been deposited.

Membership - David Jaschke: Dave reported that we ended the month of April with 133 members, which was down by five from March, and down from 143 members (a difference of 10 members) from April 30, 2015. Membership activity for April was very low. We had four transactions, with three of these being renewals and one new member with a credit card. We did not have any KAGI entries. Maybe May will be better.

Programming Report - Steve Bridgham: Steve talked to Reagan Atkinson two days ago and Reagan is good to go for our September meeting. He still needs to talk to Doug Smith about getting contact info for Bob LeVitus. We still need to finalize August (AppleScript and Automator) and October (home networking). Steve talked to Dave Hamilton about coming back in May 2017; Dave is good with this as long as he gets appropriate notice.

HAAUG Electronic Communications Systems - Ryan Eisworth:

Ryan reported that a non-member has been posting on our Facebook page and has posted an actual advertisement about his business on the Facebook page. Advertisements for commercial purposes for non-members should be removed as quickly as possible; some "light use" for members can be allowed. If we have someone who has presented here who is a non-member, or who has some affiliation to HAAUG, this can be allowed.

Regarding ads in the Apple Barrel, we want to set the base rate for ads for \$30.00 for a full-page ad for a six-month period.

New Business

Formal HAAUG Audit Report: Phil does not have the formal audit report yet, but will have this next month.

Phil asked for a budget of \$900.00 to cover reimbursement for presenter expenses for Dave Hamilton. The Board unanimously approved this budget request. We will reimburse Dave directly for his plane fare; Phil needs to be reimbursed for Dave's hotel expenses and meal expenses.

Phil indicated that he could have the HAAUG logo put on a shirt supplied by a Board member for a charge of \$17.00.


