There is a mixed bag of news from Apple; sales this year were lower than 2015 and upper management including Tim Cook received a smaller bonus than last year. On the other hand the App store recorded three billion in sales in December. Apple reported that the App Store generated 20 billion dollars for developers in 2016. Apple is scheduled to have its earnings call for the last quarter of the calendar year 2016 at the end of January.

Go back ten years where were you; do you remember this "So... Three things: A widescreen iPod with touch controls. A revolutionary mobile phone. And a breakthrough internet communications device. An iPod... a phone... and an internet communicator... An iPod, a phone... are you getting it? These are not three separate devices. This is one device! And we are calling it iPhone." If you were a Mac user for a long time; this is the time we would be looking forward the Macworld expo and the Apple Keynote. CES and the Macworld Expo happened at the same time in January. This is when Apple would announce the new version of OS X, new products like the iPhone. Now Apple announces updates and new products when they are ready. I always wanted to attend a Macworld but my work schedule got in the way.

Ten Years of iPhone

Ten years ago this month, the public got their first glimpse of the long-rumored Apple iPhone. I recall watching the keynote and comparing the phone's features to those of my Palm Treo 700p. The Treo had several advantages over the iPhone (which at launch didn't even have a to-do list application) but the feature that really grabbed me on the iPhone was the Safari web browser.

Mobile web browsing in 2007 was a painful thing. You either got the full-fledged desktop version of the website which rendered terribly on the mobile browsers of the era and often didn't work at all, or you got a heavily distilled and usually text-only version that seemed designed to render on the most spartan flip phone that had browsing capabilities. The iPhone promised a rich Internet experience with the same rendering capabilities as the Mac OS Safari web browser (though devoid of Adobe Flash).

As the months between the announcement and retail release ticked by, I wavered back and forth on buying one. In addition to my interest in the iPhone, I also wanted to change phone carriers to AT&T as the coverage with my

provider at the time had actually gotten worse since I started with them, and the iPhone launch seemed like an opportune time to make the switch. The day before the iPhone launch I watched on tech news sites and television as lines at Apple Stores and AT&T locations grew, with people camping out hoping for a shot at buying Apple's latest gadget. I decided that if I could go on launch day to my local AT&T store (in rural Brenham) and buy one, I'd do it.

About fifteen minutes before the local launch time I went over to the AT&T store. There were four people in line and a Brinks armored car was dropping off the precious cargo. Two of the people in line were just looking, and one other person was interested in buying the phone. I asked if he was going to get the 4 GB or 8 GB version. "The 8 GB, of course," he said. I think just about everyone opted for the extra storage.

Within 30 minutes of leaving my house, I was back home with a new AT&T cellular plan and a new iPhone. I unboxed the phone in earnest, powered it on and put in my SIM card, only to find myself "waiting for activation" like the thousands

of others who had also taken the plunge, but were now waiting on Apple's servers to breathe life into their phones.

Right before I was about to give up and go to sleep, the phone sprung to life and let me begin using it. I stayed up for five more hours exploring the features and settings for myself. There were things about my Treo that I missed, but the iPhone made up for it in with responsiveness, simplicity, and that wonderful web browser.

It's been an exciting decade watching the iPhone's capabilities expand and grow into what we have today. Here's to another decade of iOS!

Board of Directors Meeting Minutes for November 19, 2016

Houston Area Apple Users Group - Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Directors August 20, 2016

Call to Order: By President Phil Booth at 1:25 PM following the conclusion of the November General Meeting. Jeff Davis is looking for a good bookkeeper due to a personal matter in his family.

Monthly Reports

Secretary - Jack Adair: The minutes of the October 2016 BOD meeting were approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report - Clair Jaschke: Clair reported that our checking account balance as of the end of October 2016 was \$3,781.02. Our savings account balance was \$10,003.80, for total cash on hand of \$13,784.82. All bills have been paid and all monies have been deposited. Clair sent out a draft of the proposed 2017 budget and got only one comment. We will dis-

cuss this again at the December meeting before presenting to the membership.

Membership - David Jaschke: Dave reported that we ended the month of October with 133 members, which was up by one from September, and down from 138 members (a difference of 5 members) from October 31, 2015. We had eight membership transactions in September, of which five were by credit card. We had two lapsed members renew and six regular renewals. Ryan and Dave got Square hooked up to our website so that we can now do on-line membership transactions. Monies from Square are in our bank account the next day, which is a welcome change from the KAGI days.

Programming Report - Steve Bridgham: Doug Smith bowed out for December, so we may have to put together a panel discussion for December. This could possibly involve discussing where the good deals are. Phil reported that he will be off next week and may be off the following week as well to discuss how we may be able to use the Civic Center, even possibly for the next Swap Meet in January. There are also concerns that we were not informed about the event last night that prevented

us from setting up, and about not being notified about the Bellaire Fun Run this morning that caused some issues. Phil will try to address this with the folks at the City of Bellaire.

HAAUG Electronic Communications Systems - Ryan Eisworth: Ryan was not present but did provide a report via E-mail. Phil suggested that everyone read the report.
