Celebrate all things Mac with Bob "Dr. Mac" LeVitus and others

Sat., April 26 1st MacFest coming

Bob "Dr. Mac" LeVitus will headline HAAUG's MacFest—a celebration of all things Mac—on Saturday, April 26. LeVitus is the author of OS X for Dummies and The

OS X Files, plus more than 30 other books on Macintosh computing. He will keynote HAAUG's first MacFest with sessions that uncover the features of OS X, Apple's latest operating system. MacFest is a full day celebration of all things Mac. The event also features sessions on Adobe Photoshop and Microsoft Office for OS X.

Isabelle MacCrimmon, a Certified Adobe Expert, leads sessions on using Adobe PhotoShop, the flagship image editing software. Her sessions explore the application in depth.

Sessions covering the Microsoft Office suite of applications, including Entourage the e-mail, contact manager, and calendaring application, are scheduled. The Office suite includes Word and Excel.

In addition to the sessions, Mac users can network with

other users, vendor representatives, and festival faculty. Join HAAUG at MacFest from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM at the Courtyard by Marriott 3131 West Loop just north of Richmond Avenue in the Galleria area.


HAAUG meets at Rice University
