

cine as well as Chief of Vascular Surgery at the Houston Veterans Affairs Medical Center.


He joined HAAUG in January 2001 and attended the main meetings and the OS X SIG.

# Under the Hood: Dozens of utilities enhance OS 9 & X

This is the continuation of a series of articles on freeware, shareware and commercial utilities for OS 9 and X.

### **VISAGE**

(SHAREWARE OS X)



One feature I have always liked about the Mac is the ability to customize its appearance. Visage allows you to change the skins for the Boot Panel, Login Panel, Login Background, and Dock. If you like to give your Mac a personality unique unto itself, give Visage a try.

### **DUALITY**

(SHAREWARE OS X)

Duality is the perfect companion to Visage. It allows you to customize Finder themes or skins. It is also the first application to change Icon Sets. This ability opens up an entire new area to

developers. Duality also lets you preview changes before you apply them. One word of warning: although Duality is already 10.2 compatible, older themes may not be, and can corrupt the OS 10.2 Finder to the point that you have to reinstall it. However, an application called Theme Fur is supposed to upgrade old

themes to run under 10.2. I recommend that you go to resexcellence.com after you get 10.2. They have sections that are devoted to all types of skins and other applications for OS 9 & X.

### MOONDOCK (FREEWARE OS X)

With the help of MoonDock, you can

now watch the moon going through its phases each month.from your desktop. With your mouse, you can place a moon on your desktop wherever you want. You can also set the size and transparency level of the moon. If you double click on the moon, a data sheet will come up telling you what phase it is in, the surface visibility, and

dates for next Full and New Moon.

### **XOUNDS**

(SHAREWARE OS X)

The lack of system sounds in OS X seems to take the life out of my Mac. Xounds restores these sounds from OS 9 to OS


X, but you cannot assign sounds to specific functions. However, you can go online and find other sound sets that work with Xounds. If you want to restore some personality to your Mac, Xounds is a great choice.

In concluding



this look at the software under the hood of my Mac, everything I have listed will work with OS 9.2.2 and 10.1.5. With these applications, I have not seen any degradation in the Mac's performance. I cannot predict how these OS X applications will work with 10.2, but I plan to install 10.2 on one of my other volumes and slowly test to see what works without damaging my 10.1.5 system. I strongly recommend that you do the same. We like to think that Apple has gotten all the bugs out, but I am sure we will see an update within the first few weeks of its release. Whether software is Freeware, Shareware, or Commercial, it still comes down to user beware. Make sure that your most critical data is backed up before venturing into unknown waters!


