Other study sessions will feature Microsoft's Office suite of applications, which includes MS Word, Excel, Entourage e-mail, contact manager, and a calendaring application.

The iKea iDea, foolish thoughts for April

April 1, 2004 – 23:06 CST Could the world's richest man be shopping for an Apple – Apple Computer, Inc.? Would it be a good fit?

Certainly, we're not talking about Microsoft founder Bill Gates. He's, well, *small potatoes* these days compared to Ingvar Kamprad, the Swedish entrepreneur who founded the retail furniture chain IKEA and who has amassed a \$53 billion fortune, compared to Gates's meager \$47 billion, as *Forbes* magazine figures it.

Kamprad opened his first IKEA in Älmhult, Sweden in 1958, and his first American store in Philadelphia in 1985. By 2003, IKEA's 186 stores in 32 countries had 347,567,000 shoppers who spent over 12,370,000,000 euros, giving the company some 20% of the furniture market. Apple, by contrast, with some 3% of computer sales, has only recently moved into retailing its products through company-owned stores, whose profitability have been a closely guarded secret. Some analysts doubt whether, in fact, Apple's retail venture has added any value at all to the company's bottom line, saying that the Apple Store concept is just the latest in a long line of founder Steve Jobs's "snow jobs." Regardless, the chance to have all those IKEA shoppers spending big bucks on Apples would seem enticing.

The "iKea iDea," as it's being called, seems on first blush a natural, considering all those *iSomething* Apple products, from the wildly trendy and popular (not to mention, just plain good) iPod, to iTunes, iPhoto, iMovie, iChat, iDVD, iBook, and (lest we forget what started *iT* all) the iMac.

Both companies have their own quirky corporate cultures that venerate their leaders and products with outstanding style. Apple's computers are famous for their elegant, holistic simplicity and ease of use, while IKEA's furnishings are admired for embodying the spareness and clean lines of the best of Scandanavian design. Both Jobs and Kamprad have auras that need to be demystified, it's been said.

Perhaps, though, the differences between the companies are just too great. While both companies have their own unique perceptions about their places in the marketplace, they couldn't be more different. The IKEA vision is "to create a better everyday life for the masses" . . . "by offering a wide range of

well-designed, functional home furnishing products at prices so low that as many people as possible will be able to afford them." Apple, on the other hand, has always battled the notion that its products are priced too high, and some of its allure can no doubt be traced to the resultant perceived exclusivity.

The companies' leaders seem a study in contrast, too. IKEA's chief eschews fame, preferring frugality: Kamprad lives in Switzerland, to avoid Sweden's punishingly high taxes, and most afternoons does his own shopping for fresh fruit and veggies, driving his 10-year-old Volvo. Apple's head runs a Hollywood studio on the side and gets around in his own corporate jet.

Well, it was an idea.

Note: At last report, IKEA and its head were denying that Kamprad's wealth is so great.



Call to Order: 6:30 P.M.

Announcements: David Jaschke presented statement of new Board Reporting Procedures. These procedures will not be enforced tonight. They designed to cut down on discussion and speed the meetings along by providing limited time for reports and include having reports distributed to the Board members at least the day before the Board meeting. James Warren announced that CompUSA needs full-time Mac people.

REPORTS: Secretary: Clair Jaschke presented the unapproved February minutes. These were approved. 1st Vice President: Doug Smith: March: Bruno Courbage will present PhotoTouch Pro by Binuscan. January and February transactions will be posted to 2004 after 2003 is closed. **Boutique Manager:** Barbara Long (acting) At the February general meeting, sales totaled \$82 (4 caps, 2 mugs, 1 t-shirt). **Membership:** Morton Butler Barbara Long reported that there were 21 new members who joined at the February meeting plus several new members who joined by mail and by Kagi for a total of 39 new members. No expired memberships have been lapsed yet so our total membership is 500 members. The membership database is still under construction (functions and structure). It is being designed in FileMaker Pro 7.0. Rex will get a copy for HAAUG. Volunteers will be found to assist Mort at the general meetings. MacFest is scheduled for May 1 at the Bellaire Civic Center. Confirmed presenters are Shawn King, Bob

Levitus and two Office application presentations. He is working on other presenters and sponsors. Next meeting is March 9 at the Stag's Head Pub. Casey reported that there will be an announcement at the March general meeting to appeal for sponsors and there will be a volunteer booth. MacFest tickets will go on sale in March: \$25 for members, \$35 at the doors; \$35 for non-members; \$45 at the door. Sponsorships are \$500 – gold, \$250 – silver, and \$100. The committee is getting bids on BBQ lunch to be served at MacFest. **Relocation Committee:** Joe Kudrna (Rex Covington, David Crook) Joe Kudrna reported the committee has not met this month. MicroCenter is confirmed for March and may be the April meeting place if it is available. This motion was tabled. David Jaschke said he needs agenda items by the Friday before the Board meeting. A motion was approved to rent chairs, tables, trashcans, and podium with speaker system for up to \$350 for the March meeting. **Adjourned:** 8:59 P.M.
