

Part Five: 1983—New Disk Library and New Apple

1983—New Disk Library and New Apple

Mike Kramer finally came to his senses in late 1982 and decided to not run for a second term as president. Steve Knouse became the first HAAUG president to be elected while not actually a member of the club. Clark Johnson joined Steve as Vice President, and Ruth Hughes became the new treasurer. Midge Kocen replaced Lee Gilbreth as membership chairman in mid-year. An expanded Board of Directors was formed through a change in the bylaws in the fall. This new board consisted of the club officers, the past president, and six directors-at-large.

Another problem confronting software library managers was Apple's change from a 13-sector to a 16sector disk format in 1980. Initially, separate copy programs were required for these two formats. In 1983 HAAUG converted all of its 13-sector library to the new format and discontinued its support of the 13sector format.

Phil Lauter became disk librarian in mid-1983. Phil instituted a change to the copy session format and began a major revision to the library catalog. This latter project was continued under the direction of Jim Bradshaw, who replaced Phil in early 1984.

The Apple Barrel was loose-leaf (folded and stapled) until February. In August, the cover went to a slick paper stock. October saw the first cover with the upright pic at the computer console on top of the capital "H." The hog-on-a-platter was put on the back cover as part of the return address logo.

1983 provided the setting for a dazzling new product from Apple, the Lisa computer. A product well in advance of its time, the Lisa suffered from too much computer, too different an interface, too expensive, and too much competition form "Big Blue" (IBM). It was, of course, the precursor to the Macintosh. Apple's aggressive attempt to invade the top offices of the Fortune 500 was unsuccessful. The top management people in these companies had not yet realized they would have to adapt to these new computers sooner or later, but for now they felt these machines were only to be used by secretaries and clerks.

Apple Computer Company also introduced the latest Apple II. The Apple //e computer was unveiled at the same January stockholders meeting as the Lisa. The //e solved a lot of problems and limitations of the old][+. The motherboard had been redesigned to allow for easy memory expansion, the video display was expanded to 80 columns, a complete keyboard with both upper- and lower-case display was created, and it was able to run all of the previous Apple II applications. The Apple //e kept the Apple II line going for quite a while. It allowed VisiCalc : Advanced Version to run at the II level. Until this time, it had required an Apple III computer to run. The appearance of the //e created the avenue for a new product to appear. "The Incredible Jack" was a "three-in-one" program that included a spreadsheet, a database and a word processor all integrated into one package. This precursor to AppleWorks could only run on the //e.

While Apple was still trying to break into the upper levels of the business world, IBM was developing a new home-user computer. The much-awaited, and not well-remembered, PCjr was released in 1983. A small memory base, a "not-ready-for-prime-time" keyboard and memory modules (like those of the old Ataris) proved to be a monumental failure. To an office worker, any home computer they would buy from IBM had to support Lotus 123. With the way IBM designed the PCjr this was not possible without a memory redesign or a much-despised plug-in memory module. THe latter was also overly priced for the home consumer.

Well, that is enough for now. Next time I will cover events from 1984 up to the present. Apple unveils a new and decisive product that was to forever change the look of computing and change HAAUG. Until then, happy computing!

Harmon/Kardon® SoundSticks II

Life was fine before the offer. "Hey, Doug. Want to review some speakers?" I thought no harm could come of it. I was wrong. I thought my speakers were fine. I had purchased them at the Apple Store for half price. I was wrong. Micah placed some box of stick-like things in my car and said "Let me know what you think of these. See you in a month." No problem, right? Did I tell you that I was wrong yet?

Let's set the stage, or desktop in this case. I have over 4000 tunes in my iTunes library. That came from a full month of work ripping CDs into my library one by one before I ever purchased an iPod. Music is playing continuously on my desktop. Good sound matters to me. My speaker were fine, I thought so before this exercise. I was wrong. The "box" in question contained Harmon/Kardon SoundSticks II with their own powered sub-woofer. They do not appear powerful. I tried a few tunes to check out the range and response of the setup. Then came an old version of "Roll Over Beethoven" by ELO that starts off so easy and classical. I heard nuances in the music for the first time. I also heard a thumping sound that did match the beat of the music. That was my wife at the door. She hates it when I am 17 again and in control of the volume. Thank goodness it was Sunday afternoon and not the middle of the night. She is much more understanding mid-days, so are the neighbors.

Back to the speakers. Next came Elton John's "Live in Australia" album, Frank Sinatra classics, George Strait (fight the urge to two-step here), and a bit of INXS. This setup is perfect! In GarageBand, everything is crystal clear and easy to work with. Playing DVD movies feels like a little theater at my desk. I tried "The Day After Tomorrow" and it sounded very real—too real at points. The room became too cold, so I moved my feet next to the blue glow of the sub-woofer to keep them warm. It turns out I did need new speakers. Thank goodness I have these.


Micah, about me returning these next at next month's meeting. I was wrong. •




