Apple Announces Two-for-One Stock Split

Cupertino, California—February 11,2005

Apple [has announed] that its Board of Directors has approved a two-for-one split of the Company's common stock and a proportional increase in the number of Apple common shares authorized from 900 million to 1.8 billion. Each shareholder of record at the close of business on February 18, 2005 will receive one additional share for every outstanding share held on the record date, and trading will begin on a split-adjusted basis on February 28, 2005.

Geek-y HAAUG Server Stuff

For months we've had what we call triple 9 uptime, it's impossible to have 100% uptime, because something always goes down, a router somewhere or what ever, but our servers have been doing great, with the exception of a power outage in the building, which resulted in both servers being off line for 1.5 hours, they've been up and running 100% of the time. The really cool thing was after the power outage, both machines restarted automatically, with all hard drives spinning back up and all services coming back online with out any people involved. CPU utilization averages just below 20% for the haaugnet.org server with the haaug.org/haaug heaven server just over 20%. CPU peaked at almost 90% on haaugnet.org and at 67% for haaug.org/haaugheaven. Network traffic peaked on haaug.org/haaug heaven at 247.58KB/s and 246.12KB/s on haaugnet.org. Both servers could handle many more users and we look forward to pushing these CPU's alot harder. •




