




iRemember Review

Making scrapbooking a snap.

Scrapbooking is big business - \$2.5 billion in 2004. It is the second most popular craft in the US and millions of people labor making scrapbooks out of paper, stickers, photographs, glue, ribbons and other accessories. iRemember has some good news for you. It's much easier and more fun to make your scrapbooks digitally - not to mention, neater.

Initially, I was skeptical when I first started playing with iRemember. I've never been really interested in scrapbooks but iRemember made it so easy that I am now a fan. The main skill necessary is drag and drop and I can do that very well. The program is pretty much intuitive and, with a little trial and error, I was able to easily make pages with photos of my dogs and add text to tell the story of their adventures. You can add clip



art and borders, backgrounds, and extras to make your pages look really spiffy.

iRemember comes with over 500 templates to help you create your pages quickly or you can create your own. There are also over 3,000 clip art images and over 100 backgrounds as well as phrases, poems, and scripture verses that are easily found using categories and keywords in iRemember's ClipArt viewer.

The following image formats are supported: jpeg, pdf, and tiff. iRemember leaves the original photos untouched and works with iPhoto. Supported text file formats are rtf, rtfd, text, and Microsoft Word.

The Inspector window that floats to the far right of the main screen allows you to fine tune your pages. You can rotate and resize photos and crop them to the desired shape and then outline the photos with your favorite color. Adding shadows gives your pages dramatic 3D effects. Shapes filled with patterns or colors can be used to

make wonderful backgrounds for your pages.


Your scrapbook can contain as many pages as you wish. One benefit of the software is that there is a page drawer to the right of the main screen that shows you how each page of your album looks. If your scrapbook has a specific theme, this drawer can help keep you on track. Add a new page by clicking on the "+" button at the bottom of this drawer.

You can create scrapbooks in a number of different sizes including 12 x 12 which is the standard size for scrapbook pages. The default is 8.5 by 11 inches but you can even

make custom sizes. You can either print the pages or save them digitally.

Because of the size of the program and the clip art files, two gigabytes of free space is recommended. The program ran quickly on my PowerBook G4 1.67 ghz with 1.5 gig of memory but I would suspect that patience would be required if you use this program on an older G3 machine with low memory. The program will run on Panther but Tiger is recommended. The cost is \$49.95.

I had a lot of fun with this program and if you are into scrapbooking, I recommend that you give iRemember a close look.
