

Monthly Address from the HAAUG President



Keeping up the energy.

I hope that you've been following the news about the Li-Ion batteries. First Dell recalled their Notebook/Laptop batteries, then Apple announced a similar recall for batteries used in models from 2003. Apple also recalled Macbook Pro batteries because of quality issues. So August seems to be the battery month.

Like the Marathon runner manufacturers have hit the wall with battery capacity. Every portable computer owner wants a machine that has the power of desktop with a battery that lasts on a four-hour flight. These high capacity batteries throw off a lot of heat, and if there is a problem in the manufacturing the problem is multiplied. We will publish the serial number range later in the issue so check your batteries , so if you think you have an effected computer contact check the Apple Website.

Apple announced this week changes to the iMac and Mac Mini lines. The iMac received the new 64 bit Intel Cord 2 Duo processors, that promises to be up to 50% faster. The clock speeds start at 1.83 and top out at 2.33 Gigahertz. The big announcement was the addition of a 24" model. You can also upgrade the video card and have a good gaming machine. The other announcement was the upgrading of the Mac Mini line so the low end as well as the higher end machines now has dual core processors. The clock rate is 1.66 on the \$600 machine and 1.83 on the \$800 machine. Again consult the Apple website for more details.

HAAUG's web site recently under went some renovation and we have Tamara to thank for the redesign. This is just one of the many things that Tamara has done for the organization. In addition to editing the Barrel she is the one person HAAUG Graphics department.

Undiscovered Country

The release of "Boot Camp" BETA!

Apple[®] released "Boot Camp" beta to allow Mac users who have Intel Macs to install and run a copy of Windows. For those people whose jobs require they run Windows applications or who must run applications that just are not available in a Macintosh[®] format, being able to run Windows[®] is a good thing. In the past, alternate applications were required to allow the Macintosh[®] to emulate an Intel PC. Programs such as Virtual PC allowed Mac users to install and run Windows[®]. But in emulator mode Windows runs s-l-o-w-l-y. On an Intel Mac, Windows[®] runs in "native" mode and doesn't require an emulator. This means that Windows[®] runs at normal speed, for Windows[®] that is.

Not long after I got an Intel MacBook Pro, I downloaded Apple's Boot Camp and installed it. Boot Camp allows you to partition or section off a portion of your hard drive to be used as a space for Windows[®]. Because of my limited space, I started with a very small Windows[®] partition. The installation of Windows[®] went smoothly and Boot Camp generates a CD with drivers for Windows[®] to use to access Macintosh[®] features and systems. I was able to install all the Windows[®] software that I needed to connect to my company. All worked well until the first upgrade to Boot Camp.

The latest Boot Camp fixes many problems and allows you to access more of the Macintosh's features. In particular the latest version allows you to use the "delete" key as a Windows® Delete key instead of acting as a "backspace" key. This is needed to enter the famous "CTRL-ALT-DELETE" three finger salute to access many Windows® features. It also adds the ability to use the Apple command keys to act as the "right-click" button. Other improvements were also added.


Unfortunately the partition size was too small and I could not get the new drivers to install. I ultimately had to remove the partition and create a new one and reinstall Windows[®] and all my applications from scratch. The new drivers work great and make the experience much more pleasurable. As with most things done by Apple[®], this version of Boot Camp is better and I expect that the version that will be released as a part of Leopard will be much better. If you really must run Windows, the free Apple[®] Boot Camp is definitely one good way to go and discover the undiscovered country.


