



Looking into the future.

This seems to the pause before the storm when it comes to Apple News. Even the folks at MacWorld were commenting on the lack of announcements coming from Cupertino. There are lots of rumors that are bubbling about new machines and when the OS will be updated. The only products that we heard about were the iPhone not available until June and AppleTV, which Apple said, would be delayed to mid March.

If you are a developer, or major IT manager the next event on the calendar is the Apple World Wide Developer's Conference. This year it is scheduled for early June. This conference is designed for those who develop the software that we buy. This is a chance for developers to talk to Apple engineers, so that there products will work correctly. There are other tracks for the IT managers and people who produce media.

If you missed the February Meeting you missed one of Bob LeVitus's best presentations. He gave his view of the health of Apple and demonstrated several applications that will improve your computing experience. It was a great show. In March we will be demonstrating Parallels, the software that will allow you to run Microsoft Windows in a window of OS X. This is virtual machine technology with Parallels you can share data between OS X and Windows easier. Apple has Boot camp that will allow you to boot in to windows on an Intel Mac, but sharing data can be problematic.

MacFest is coming, the date has been chosen, the speakers have been invited so circle September 29th, We are just in the beginning stages of planning so there are few details but the date is set. I think that there will be a range of speakers that will interest a range of Mac fans. Returning again this year will be the Mac Trivia Challenge, which will be your chance to test your knowledge of the Macintosh, and win prizes. The committee will be looking for sponsorships and prizes, so see a member of the board if you would like to sponsor the event.

Remember that HAAUG has an evening SIG at Ziggys covering FileMaker Pro. We meet on the Third Tuesday of the month. Rex has started a series of sessions that will create an invoicing system for a small business. He also takes time to answer questions on all aspects of the application. FileMaker is one of those programs that when you open and have a blank canvas, and needs some work on your part before it will work for you. If you do any database work FileMaker is one of the easiest database to setup and run.

If you have recently renewed your membership, I appreciate that you have again trusted HAAUG to be your computer help resource. You have my thanks for renewal.



Of the HAAUG Board of Director's Meeting - February 6, 2007

Attendees: Tamara Alexander, Philip Booth, Rex Covington (via iChat), Amy Denton, Michael Epstein, Joe Fournet, Clair Jaschke, David Jaschke, Michael Miron, Carol Mouton, Rick Roberts, and Doug Smith.

Call to order: 6:40 p.m. by President, Philip Booth, who requested Clair Jaschke to take minutes o the meeting in the absence of Secretary Jim Connell.

General Announcements/General Meeting Recap: The January Swap Meet went well. We added extra tables to accommodate the sellers and saved money by using a smaller room.

MONTHLY REPORTS

Secretary: The minutes of the board meeting held on January 4, 2007, were approved without amendments.

Treasurer – Barbara Long: Barbara Long was not present at the meeting but had earlier submitted a copy of the 2007 budget. The financial reports for January will be distributed shortly after the meeting.

1st Vice President – Doug Smith: Main presentations for the next three General Meetings are as follows:

February: Bob "Dr. Mac" LeVitus, "State of the Mac" Address

March: Parallels Desktop for Mac

April: Mac OS X 10.5 Leopard, with Dreux Ste. Marie (tentatively scheduled, based upon the release date of Leopard, which is rumored to be March 24, and subject to Dreux's schedule).

Main presentation topics for the remainder of the year are to be announced.

Doug reported that those who attended Macworld had a good time. He met with several, mostly small vendors at Macworld, who are interested in coming to Houston, and was interviewed on camera by MacLife Magazine (formerly MacAddict).

2nd Vice President – Mike Miron: Rice University Media Center is scheduled for reconstruction sometime in the future, but the actual date is not know at this time. HAAUG should be okay to meet there for the time being.

SIG Coordinator – Rick Roberts: No major changes in the SIG schedule are planned. The SIG schedule for February should be the same as the schedule for the December 2006 General Meeting, unless there are last minute changes.

Apple Barrel Editor and Webmaster– Tamara Alexander: A list of the new board of directors is needed for the Apple Barrel. The website needs to be updated with the list of the current board members and pictures of the new board members.

Membership – David Jaschke: HAAUG had 244 members at the end of January, consisting of 231 regular members, 4 student members, 1 associate member, and 8 lifetime members. At the end of January 2006, HAAUG had 281 members.

In January 2007, five new members joined HAAUG, and 25 members renewed their membership.

HAAUG Heaven Forum – Robert Lacey: No Report. Phil Booth stated that the HAAUG Heaven Forum and HAAUGNet are running okay.

Boutique: No report. **HAAUGNet:** No report.

The following appropriations were approved:

1. Up to \$750 per month for the cost of renting the Rice University Media Center for HAAUG General Meetings; and

2. Up to \$1,300 for a new projector.

The following matters were deferred until next month:

- 1. Purchase of a new Airport Base Station; and
- 2. Purchase of a laptop to be used by presenters.

The Apple Lisa that was recently donated to HAAUG will be sold on eBay, with the proceeds going to HAAUG.


