New start. New Year.

In January it will be thirty years since a group of people got together and formed the Houston Area Apple Users Group. As we all know times have changed. At the start of the organization the computer we focused on was the Apple II. In the late 80s the club concentrated on Macintosh users.

When HAAUG formed the use of a personal computer was considered a hobby, now the computer is used as a tool to pursue a hobby, or a profession. Thirty years ago users, were more apt to write a computer program, than a paper. The users were looking for help perfecting their software. The coming of the Mac and of the IBM PC turned the curiosity into an item used by non-geeks. So the group's population changed from computer hobbyists to members wanting to know about the commercial software then coming on the market.

Everyone knows about the markers of history BC and AD well there will be a new time marker that historians will chronicle, BI and SI Before Internet and Since Internet. You can peg the Internet age to about 1994. Up to that time HAAUG had a large disk library that was brought to every meeting. The Library held all kinds of programs, fonts, and clip art. Well if you are looking for shareware today you go to Internet sites like Versiontracker.com, or Download. com. Apple released OSX 10.5 and a week later the software update application notified you that an update was available.

The Internet has allowed Apple, Microsoft and other companies to update their OS's, and other software almost continuously. Getting software updates out to users was one of the jobs that User Groups performed. If there was an update to System 7 or 8 you got it from HAAUG, went to an apple dealer, or ordered it from Apple. I don't remember updates coming out as often as they do now. Now small software firms like Smile on My Mac can create software and not produce physical media. Download it from their website, and purchase a license code all without going to the store.

The nature of user groups has changed to a tech support roll while continuing the social aspect of the group. Several User groups have moved on-line. Our colleagues in HAL-PC abandoned their monthly meeting several years ago. Now they just have SIGS and special courses.

HAAUG is facing many of the same issues that other groups have. Our membership is in the 270's, which is up over last year. But we are always looking for new members and new members to take leadership rolls. The club will need to develop more outreach opportunities like MacFest and the Annual Photo Contest. We will need to wring revenue from all sources. This does NOT Mean a dues increase. It does mean locating sponsors for the Apple Barrel haaug.org and meetings. At the December meeting the members that attend will approve

Call to order: 6:37 p.m. by President Philip Booth.

General Announcements/General Meeting Recap: Phil Booth reported that the October General Meeting was one of the most successful this year. More than sixty members and guests attended Dreux Ste. Marie's presentation on Mac OS X v.10.5 Leopard, which Apple released the prior evening.

MONTHLY REPORTS:

Secretary: The minutes of the board meetings held on September 4, 2007, were unanimously approved as submitted.

Treasurer – Barbara Long: Barbara has not received all of the financial information for October 2007 but submitted a preliminary financial report for the month to the board by email message. HAAUG had a bank balance of \$10,374.38 at the end of October, with a preliminary month-to-day loss of \$303.70 and a preliminary year-to-date loss of \$2,908.66. Barbara expects to submit final financial reports for October 2007 to the board as soon as she has the final financial activity for the month.

Ist Vice President – Doug Smith: The following main presentations have been scheduled for upcoming General Meetings:

November:	Michael Garfield, the "High-Tech Texan"	
December:	Presentation on Aperture/Election of Officers	
January:	Semi-Annual Swap Meet	
February:	Bob "Dr. Mac" LeVitus's State of the Mac Address	

After discussion, the board decided to end the submissions for the 2007 Photo Contest on December 31, 2007, and to announce the winners at the Swap Meet on January 26, 2008.

nd Vice President – Mike Miron: Mike Miron reported that no progress has been made on finding a new location for HAAUG's monthly meetings beginning in February 2008. Due to a change of policy at Rice University Media Center on non-university groups meeting at the Media Center, HAAUG will not meet at the Media Center after December 2007. The board discussed various alternative meeting locations, including the Looscan Neighborhood Library, located at 2510 Willowick; the Bellaire Civic Center, where HAAUG has met in the past; and the Power Center, located at South Post Oak and US-90. The Looscan Neighborhood Library has a meeting room that will hold 177 people and that can be reserved in advance. The library does not open until 10:00 a.m. on Saturdays, however. Phil Booth reported that renovations at Bellaire Civic Center have been completed but parking has been relocated a block from the building.

SIG Coordinator – Rick Roberts: Rick Roberts reported that at the October General Meeting Jonathan Magnus's SIG was cut to one hour from two hours so that the meeting could end an hour earlier in the afternoon. After discussion, the board decided to return to having Jonathan's SIG last two hours at the November General Meeting. At the November General Meeting the main presentation will start at 9:00 a.m., because the speaker will need to leave shortly after 10:00 a.m. to host his Saturday radio show. The business meeting will be held from 10:30 a.m. to 10:45 a.m. Jonathan Magnus's SIG will begin at 10:45 a.m. and conclude at noon.

Apple Barrel Editor- Tamara Alexander: No report.

Webmaster - Jeff Davis: Jeff Davis reported by email that the servers are

working normally.

Membership – David Jaschke: HAAUG had 256 members (246 regular members, 2 student members and 8 lifetime members) at the end of October, one more member than HAAUG had at the end of October 2006. During the month four new members joined HAAUG, and eleven members renewed their membership, including three two-year early renewals.

HAAUG Heaven Forum/HAAUGNet-Robert Lacey: No report.

New Business:

Nominations Committee: David Jaschke announced the following nominations as of November 6, 2007: Phil Booth, President; 1 Vice President—Programming, David Crook; 2 Vice President—Facilities, Michael Miron; Secretary, Jim Connell; Treasurer, Barbara Long; Webmaster—Jeff Davis; SIG Coordinator, Rick Roberts; Membership, David Jaschke; Apple Barrel Editor, Tamara Sasha Alexander; HAAUG Heaven Sysop, Robert Lacey; Directors at Large—Doug Smith, Michael Epstein, with the remaining two positions open.

Phil Booth proposed that the board consider amending the by-laws to have a communications position that would be responsible for creating and publishing the Apple Barrel each month and for keeping the website updated and a separate position that would be responsible for maintaining HAAUG's servers. These two positions would more accurately reflect how the responsibilities are currently being handled. The board decided to defer action on this proposal until after the beginning of 2008.

MacFest 2008 Committee: Rex Covington volunteered to head the committee that will plan next year's MacFest. The speakers from this year's MacFest have indicated they would like to return for next year's event.

Budget Committee: David Jaschke reminded the board that HAAUG needs to submit a budget for 2008 at the December General Meeting. Phil Booth, Barbara Long, Clair Jaschke and David Jaschke will serve on the committee to prepare and submit a proposed budge for 2008.

30th Anniversary Celebration: HAAUG will celebrate its 30th anniversary next year. The board discussed alternatives for celebrating the event, including combining the 30th anniversary celebration with MacFest 2008, but reached no decision.

HAAUG Forums: The board will consider after the beginning of 2008 whether to continue the HAAUG Forums in the current format. Rick Roberts suggested that a mailman list be added to the Forums to alert those on the list by email when new items have been added to the Forums. The board discussed the suggestion but reached no decision.
