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
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



Mom was happy to place a Mac on her desk at home. She had been part of an equipment test program years ago and actually got a bit misty when the techs came to remove the Mac after 90 days. She had asked Dad for another, but he is a PC guy, and never one to stray from the pack.

The brother in-law Jim has built his own PC systems for years, but the Comp USA failure brought him into our fold last month. He found a "deal" on an Intel Mac Pro tower that he uses with a KVM switch in his office, sending tasks to the Mac and then going back to the PC side for work. These days, Jim's cell number is seen on my caller ID quite often, making his way thru the transition questions of a "switcher" in the progress, and I never mind his questions. The questions just make me smile, and that smile makes others in my office wonder what is going on.

Most recently, my other brother Darrell called me on my Friday off and said "Go buy me an iMac." I was off to the First Colony Apple store, and then at Darrell's home inside of three hours for the install.

The questions started almost before the box was opened, "When do we call the guy in India?" What guy do he mean I asked? It turned out both of Darrell's previous Dell systems included numerous calls to various tech support guys in India. I just asked why we needed to call anybody? He asked if I had ever hooked up a Mac to a Hughes Net ISP. I said no but I didn't feel that it would be a great deal more trouble than my DSL. Darrell looked unsure and began to look for old receipts for that number in India.

The shiny new iMac was too thin to be believed. It took up a quarter of the space of his old monitor on the desktop and the place where the Dell tower used to reside was dark. Darrell said "What about the email?" I pointed to the dock and the 22 messages in his old email account waiting in the Apple Mail application.

Darrell smiled and said "I hope that guy in India has a second job lined up." Behind him, his wife Karen and two daughters were smiling too. The time each of them sat in front of a computer was about to be something they wanted to do again, instead of something they dreaded to do. They had an iMac!

'08 Vision Committee Report

February 12, 2008

HAAUG Vision Committee Special Report

Key topics for this meeting center around:

- More members
- More volunteers
- Revenue enhancement
- AB/website improvements

Discussion took place around the need for a new meeting place. The Looscan Library seems to have been a temporary setting or at least one that might work for smaller meetings rather than the monthly gathering. Other sites mentioned have some negative aspect either in scheduling, parking or willingness to commit over time. Currently, there doesn't appear to be one location that stands out as convenient on a regular, monthly basis. Alas, the search will continue for the short term.

Programming continues to be important for attracting and keeping members. Some clubs are doing several short presentations rather than one long one. Locally, though, no speakers are lined up right now.

Having a button on Home Page to send Programming ideas for presenters was suggested along with a special blurb to be included in the next AB to request suggestions on topics for future presentations.

Despite our difficulty, HAAUG is still one of the largest groups, in respect to memberships and meetings, in the US.

The committee discussed the type of member we're trying to attract. We have mostly older members, and the younger people are not usually available on Saturday morning. We have a major disconnect with these two age groups. Possible recruiting resources include Rice, UH, Med Center MUG, Art Institute of Houston.

In answering the question: How do we want to attract members who attract?, suggestions include making HAAUG's presence available at various places like MySpace, and Facebook. These sites could be used for announcements and discussions.

As an extension of our marketing efforts, HAAUG could also look into using Flickr to promote not only our annual photo contest, but also what we have done in past and what we have coming up. We need an enhanced web presence. There is really not just one thing we can do to increase membership – we need to do several things throughout the year.

A centralized approach to coordinating this was discussed rather than putting it all on the Webmaster. Perhaps a new Marketing Committee or an extension of the Publicity Committee would be appropriate to get the movement started.

During a recent advertising meeting at UH, everyone had an iPod, a few had Macs, but no one had even heard of HAAUG. This same "level of awareness" is also found among graphic designers, though not as severe.

Bottom line: People who should know about us, don't. It's disheartening.

Following this same line of thought it was pointed out that college students wouldn't know about HAAUG unless they looked for us. Most people don't know that user groups exist! HAAUG needs to make sure the local colleges know about us. We should look into creating and generating a HAAUG podcast.

Switching gears to finances and increasing revenue, discussion centered upon the newsletter. We need to put a higher priority on selling ads and/or sponsorships. Since we have a very nice newsletter, perhaps we should look into printing it again. We could generate the revenue to do so by charging more per month and/or by getting sponsors to help with printing. We could even have sponsorships at regular meetings as long as the value was meaningful enough to the member or member company.

Sponsorships would certainly get added exposure in the AB and on the Web site in addition to time at the podium to address the audience and, if applicable, some sort of display area. How could this be managed? Would this fall under the purview of the new Marketing Coordinator?

Another top need is to generate volunteers by telling members specific needs, instead of general descriptions. Perhaps put positions with specific written requirements in next, and subsequent, Apple Barrel newsletter and announce at general meetings.

Let's be friendly about this. Best approach is to talk with a prospective volunteer, let him/her know the details of a position and then ask them to help. The need for a Volunteer Coordinator should also be a high priority.

Considering the Vision Committee had not met in over a year, it was good to flush out these concerns and considerations for HAAUG to act upon. In fact, a lot of past recommendations from this committee have been put into practice in some form or another. Now is no different than any other time in our past. HAAUG needs help to sustain itself, to grow and continue to benefit its members.

Minutes HAAUG Board of Director's Meeting - Tuesday, February 5, 2008

Attendees: Tamara Alexander, Philip Booth, Jim Connell, Rex Covington, David Crook, Jeff Davis, Amy Denton, Michael Epstein, Joe Fournet, Clair Jaschke, David Jaschke, Robert Lacey, Mike King, Barbara Long, Rick Roberts, Doug Smith, and Matt Willmore.

Call to order: 6:33 p.m. by President Philip Booth.

General Announcements/General Meeting Recap:

Phil Booth announced, with sadness, the death of Michael Miron on February 3, 2008. Michael made many contributions to HAAUG, including, in particular, securing the Rice University Media Center as the meeting place for HAAUG's General Meetings the last three years. He will be greatly missed. The board approved the donation of \$200 to Rice University Media Center, the charity that Michael's family designated, in memory of Michael.

Phil announced that the January Swap Meet was a success and that we were able to reduce the expenses for the event.

MONTHLY REPORTS:

Secretary: The minutes of the board meetings held on January 8, 2007, were unanimously approved as submitted.

Treasurer – Barbara Long: The monthly financial reports for January have not yet been prepared. All bills have been paid, and HAAUG has at least \$10,000 in the bank. The January bank deposit was sufficient to cover the cost of the facility for the January Swap Meet.

1st Vice President – Doug Smith: Bob "Dr. Mac" LeVitus's "The State of the Mac" Address is scheduled for the February General Meeting. A promotional video made by Bob is posted on HAAUG's website. No presentation is yet scheduled for the March General Meeting. Doug requested suggestions for future presentations at the General Meetings.

2nd Vice President – Mike Miron: The board discussed possible alternate locations for the General Meetings, if the Looscan Neighborhood library does not meet HAAUG's needs, including HAL-PC's offices and another auditorium at Rice University. It may also be possible to resume meeting at the Rice University Media Center later this year. The board decided to reserve the Looscan Neighborhood Library for the next three months.

SIG Coordinator – Rick Roberts: The February SIGs will include Mac 101 (one hour only) and Photography, due to the fact that the meeting will not start until 10:00 a.m. and must end no later than 2:00 p.m. Also, Bob LeVitus's address may run long at the February General Meeting.

Apple Barrel Editor – Tamara Alexander: Future editions of the Apple Barrel may include David Crook's review of books on Mac OS X Leopard, a review of the new 16 GB iPhone and technical articles from Mort Butler. Tamara requested photos from Macworld Expo and the Swap Meet for the Apple Barrel.

Webmaster – Jeff Davis: The slot in the core router went out today for about three hours. The router has now been restored, and everything is running fine.

Membership – **David Jaschke:** HAAUG had 261 members at the end of January, an increase of 17 members from January 2007. There were 20 new and renewing members last month.

HAAUG Heaven Forum/HAAUGNet—Robert Lacey:

More participation is needed in the Forum. From time to time we get a new registrant. The discussion of HAAUG's Internet services and costs was deferred to a subsequent board meeting.

OLD BUSINESS: NONE

NEW BUSINESS:

Discussion and possible replacement of 2nd Vice President for Facilities. Matt Willmore agreed to assume the duties of the 2nd Vice President. The board unanimously approved his appointment to the position. Phil thanked Matt for assuming this position.

MacFest 2008 and 30th Anniversary Celebration Committee:

Rex Covington reported that he has confirmed that Lesa Snider King, Shawn King and Andy Ihnatko are committed to be presenters at MacFest 2008 on September 6. Chris Breen is checking his calendar. Rex is trying to get Steve Wozniak to be a speaker, and Lesa King will try to get David Pogue to be a speaker. Tom Piper (vendor wizard) is going to help get a number of vendors. Smile on My Mac will be a sponsor. The Hilton University of Houston Hotel will be the venue, unless Steve Wozniak and/or David Pogue participate, in which case a larger venue may be needed. The committee will hold its initial meeting later this month.

Mentor: Amy Denton reviewed on recent requests for technical help received on the HAAUG Hotline. In the future she will forward any such requests to HAAUG Club Business email address. Jeff Davis reported that he has been getting copies of help requests and has handled the issues. The board then discussed changes to the HAAUG website to update various contact information on the website to make it easier for those needing help on computer issues to get to the right person. Tamara will distribute a list of the proposed changes to the website for review.

Discussion of Vision Committee Agenda: Joe Fournet announced that the Vision Committee will meet at Ziggy's on Tuesday, February 12. Anyone who wants to serve on the committee is invited to attend the meeting.
