

A Tale of Two Mice

QuickTip

The Mouse System Preferences pane on Leopard does not include an option to enable momentum scrolling like Snow Leopard does. However, by setting a hidden preference, you can get this feature without updating to Snow Leopard.

> To enable momentum scrolling, first run the following command in Terminal:

defaults write com.apple.driver.Appl eBluetoothMultitouch. mouse MouseMomentumScroll bool yes

Next, go to the Mouse System Preferences panel, and uncheck and then check the Scroll option. You should now have momentum scrolling enabled.

http:// www.macosxhints.com/ article.php? story=20091104090207286 Apple has released a new mouse now called Magic Mouse that has a top surface that acts like the track pad on the new MacBook Pros. The mouse that I have been using for the past year on my tower is the Logitech MX Revolution. I purchased the Magic Mouse to use with my Macbook Pro. There is a big difference between the two mice. The Logitech is large and fits in a cupped hand: 5" long, 3.5" wide, 1.50" high, 147g (5.18 oz). The Apple Magic Mouse is 4.5" long, 2.25" wide, 0.5" high, 105g (3.7 oz).

*The carapace of the Apple Mouse functions as the button—it is two-button enabled and will bring up the context menu when the right part of the shell is pressed.



I have a lot more time with the Logitech mouse since it is the primary mouse of my desktop system. It is a good mouse and I have few complaints. Despite being left handed I mouse with my right hand and the mouse is molded to fit my right hand. All of the buttons and controls are in the right place. The scroll wheel is responsive and there is a thumb wheel that will bring up my collection of dashboard widgets. If I am using a mouse-centric program like Photoshop I think that the Logitech would be the mouse to use.

My first impressions of the Apple Magic Mouse are favorable but the use and feel are different. The mouse's top shell is designed to work like the Apple

notebook computer trackpads; moving one or two fingers up and down the shell will scroll the window replacing the ball on the Mighty Mouse, or the scroll wheel on other mice. The shell will accept other multi-touch gestures. It is a small package and if you are use to a large form fitting mouse, getting used to the Apple Mouse's size and shape will take time.

Pros and Cons of Both Mice

Apple Magic Mouse

Pro

- 1. Wireless: no cable to tangle
- 2. Bluetooth: No outboard receiver needed on **Bluetooth-equipped computers**
- 3. Small: good for travel mouse
- 4. Replaceable AA batteries: available everywhere
- 5. Multi-Touch surface
- 6. Usable with left or right hand

Cons

- 1. Small: If you are used to a larger mouse this might not be your favorite
- 2. Only two buttons: left and right buttons only
- 3. Buttons not programable
- 4. Does not slide easily on all surfaces

Logitech MX Revolution

Pros

- 1. Large: fits hands
- 2. Rechargeable batteries: limited toxic waste
- 3. Multiple programable buttons
- 4. USB Receiver: usable by all computers

Cons

1. Rechargeable batteries: this is a pro and con. When the battery is dead you can't just change the batteries; I have a cheap mouse to use when

it is recharging. Battery is not replaceable so you will need to dispose of the whole mouse at the end of life.

- 2. Right handed only: Logitech only sells a right hand version
- 3. Heavy: might get tiring if you are using mouse intensive applications

Conclusions

Both mice have pros and cons but they are good units and work well. I am still getting use to the Magic Mouse, but using the multi-touch gestures on the mouse is convenient. I also like the form-fitted Logitech mouse. Since the units have a different design it is difficult to compare on against another.

Mice are very subjective; if you are in the market for a new mouse, find a store that has a display that will allow you to test drive the unit. If the mouse does not feel good to you, it will make your computer use misery.



QuickTip

To freeze Dock items so that they do not move around

when you want to drop

an item onto an icon in the dock: Command + Option + Drag item onto dock item. Note: this method forces an application to attempt to open an item dropped onto the application's icon in the dock.

To get any item in the Dock to pop open a menu (Folder/HD pop open a quasi AppleMenu, applications pop open a menu with options to quit, show or select a window and the trash can pops open with the option to empty): Control + Click on any item in the Dock. Note: click/hold on any item in the Dock has the same but this is a bit slower

To have the Finder show you where a dock item is located: Command + Click item

To hide all other windows and show the windows of a running application: Command + Option + Click on the application icon in the dock

To hide the windows of the application in foreground and bring the windows of another application into foreground: Option + Click on the application icon in the dock. Note: This allows you to switch between two applications without hiding things like Finder Windows or the Internet Connect status window.

QuickTip

I use Boot Camp on my Mac, and quite often I create files in Windows and want those files on the OS X side as well. It's a pain to take out a USB flash drive and copy the files there, reboot, and copy them again. If the files are large, emailing the files to yourself may not work either.

One solution is **Dropbox**. As Dropbox works on OS X, Windows, and Linux, all you have to do is install Dropbox on your Boot Camp Windows installation, then drop or save any files in there; they will automatically transfer into OS X the next time you boot back into the Mac OS.

unable to connect to wireless networks unless I had already connected to them running under 10.5.8. Snow Leopard would "see" the new networks, but could not connect to them.

The Genius Bar at the Apple Store helped me solve the problem. We opened

/Library/Preferences/

SystemConfiguration, and trashed the entire contents of that folder. We also deleted all locations in System Preferences » Network, and recreated the location Automatic. Finally, we rebooted.

So far, I have been able to connect to all wireless networks that I want to using OS X 10.6.1.




