

Apple and HAAUG have both been very busy with new projects. For Apple it's the iPad and iPhone OS 4.0, along with rumors of updated MacBooks this week. For HAAUG, we've been working non-stop to create a bigger, better experience for our members. iPhone OS 4.0 Previewed

At a special media event on Thursday, April 8th, Apple introduced iPhone OS 4, which is slated for release this summer. The new mobile OS adds over 100 features according to Apple, and seems to address many of the longstanding complaints about the OS, along with adding new features. Here are some of the high notes.

Multitasking

This is likely one of the single mostrequested features of the iPhone OS; that multiple apps be allowed to run simultaneously. This has always been an interesting discussion point, as some Apple

apps already exhibit multitasking; for example, the iPod app will continue to play music after you leave the app, and you can receive calls and text messages regardless of what app you're using. Apple is addressing multitasking by adding a "tray" that appears at the bottom of the screen when you double-click the Home button; today, double-clicking can be assigned to a few different actions such as launching the Camera app.



With the huge amount of multiplayer games available for the iPhone OS, several systems exist to track scores, achievements and ranks; this is similar to Microsoft's Xbox Live. Several companies have even been created to independently handle game stats. With iPhone OS 4, Apple is introducing it's own internal platform to handle these stats and scores for all iPhone games. It's not required that developers use this system, but this will surely have a big effect on these independent score trackers, some of which charge for their services. It does show that Apple is serious about gaming on its platform and could be a precursor to more substantial game development announcements by Apple in the future.

iAds

Back at the beginning of 2010, Apple bought Quattro Wireless, a leading mobile advertising company. Originally Apple had planned to buy AdMob, but had to settle for Quattro after #1 AdMob was purchased by Google prior to that. Part of the April 8th announcement is iAds, an Apple-owned advertisement network available to iPhone developers. iAds allows a user to click on an ad and see anything from text to pictures, movies, mini-games, and even purchase items within the ad, all without leaving the current application. Apple is offering 60% of ad revenues to the developers and will host all the ads. This is without a doubt a direct competitor to Google, and it will be interesting to see how it plays out.

There are of course dozens more improvements such as improved enterprise email support, a unified email inbox, a 5x digital zoom, Grand Central Dispatch and much more. We'll cover more of these improvements as the OS gets closer to release, and when it's released we'll cover the OS in a presentation. If you have access to iPhone OS 4 and would like to demo it, we'd love to have you present!



QuickTip

In time for the iPad introduction. **NPR** has



introduced a tablet-optimized version of their website, which uses HTML5 instead of Flash. Combined with Fluid, it makes an awesome NPR app on the Mac. The tip itself is rather easy and somewhat obvious, but it is nice to see that the app works even though NPR only advertises it for Chrome, and it makes a really good standalone application.

The process is easy. If you don't have it, download Fluid. Open Fluid, and create a new app for URL http://www.npr.org/ tablet/, and name it NPR or something else. If you want to, you may want to Google for a high-resolution copy of the NPR logo, so that you can use that as the icon for the app. For that, in Fluid choose Other in the Icon pop-up menu.

After the app is created, launch it, open the application's preferences, select the Behavior section, and make sure the box next to 'Closing the last browser window' ('only hides the window') is checked. That's





HAAUG Board of Directors Meeting – Tuesday, March 2, 2010

Location: Industrial Audio/Video, Inc., 2617 Bissonnet Street, Houston, Texas.

Attendees: Philip Booth, Jim Connell, Clair Jaschke, David Jaschke, Mike King, Barbara Long (via iChat), Rick Roberts, Doug Smith (via iChat), Matt Willmore, and Greg Wright.

Call to order: 6:33 p.m. by President Matt Willmore, a quorum of voting members of the board being present.

MONTHLY REPORTS:

Secretary – Jim Connell: The minutes of the board meeting held on February 2, 2010, were unanimously approved as submitted.

Treasurer – Barbara Long: Barbara reported that HAAUG has about \$9,000 in the bank. All bills have been paid, except for Bob LeVitus's lunch after the February General Meeting. Barbara is continuing to work on getting the financial records updated.

1st Vice President – Programming – Doug Smith: Peter Cohen will give a presentation on Aperture 3 via iChat at the March General Meeting. Doug will work with Phil Booth to test the broadband at Bellaire Civic Center in advance of the March General Meeting. At this year's Macworld Expo, Greg Wright identified other individuals and companies that are interested in making presentations to HAAUG via iChat. Doug is also contacting the Mac User Groups in Austin, Dallas and San Antonio to find out who will be appearing at their meetings and whether the presenters would be interested in appearing at HAAUG's General Meetings.

2nd Vice President Facilities – Open: Phil Booth reported that he has paid the City of Bellaire for rental of Bellaire Civic Center through March. Attendees at the April General Meeting need to be alerted that an art show in the park adjacent to Bellaire Civic Center may make parking more difficult than usual.

SIG Coordinator - Rick Roberts: Rick announced

that he has no changes to the SIGs scheduled for March General Meeting. The Social Media SIG did not meet at the February General Meeting, but Rick will leave this SIG on the March SIG schedule. Now that the afternoon SIGs have been moved to the morning schedule, only one SIG meets in the second meeting room. A lunch SIG at the Daily Grill in the Galleria after cleanup of the meeting space will be added to the March SIG schedule.

Apple Barrel Editor- Open: No report.

Membership – **David Jaschke:** HAAUG had 210 members at the end of February 2010, an increase of nine members from January 2010, and a decrease of 20 members from February 2009. Last month six new members joined HAAUG, and ten members renewed their membership (four early renewals, four two-year renewals, and two one-year renewals).

Webmaster – Jeff Davis: Greg Wright discussed some options on using an 800 number to replace the current local telephone number for the HAAUG Hotline. He will report to the board next month on whether there are alternatives that would provide essentially the same functions of the current Hotline at a significantly reduced cost.

HAAUG does not have much interaction with the national MUG organization. He thought the absence of Apple this year did not detract from the experience of the event, and he welcomed the opportunity to see smaller vendors at the event.


