iPhone 4 Announced

Apple made many dreams come true during the WWDC keynote address as Steve Jobs unveiled the iPhone 4. If you remember there's been news for months on this device after an Apple engineer left a prototype iPhone in a California bar; the phone was later sold to news media outlet Gizmodo who broke the story. They are now mired in legal troubles and, unsurprisingly, were not granted press passes to this year's conference.

But back to the phone – and what a phone! Apple built on the success of the iPhone 3G and 3GS with a few solid additions including their new Retina Display, which has a resolution of 326ppi, a resolution so fine that Apple claims most people will not be able to discern individual pixels on the display from 10-12 inches away. (By contrast, the current iPhone 3GS has a screen resolution of 163ppi.) This makes the iPhone's screen the highest-resolution display in a phone available today. That number will likely be surpassed in the future, but for now it's the best you can buy.

Apple also made a major change to the overall structure of the phone. Instead of an internal frame coupled with bezels and a curved back plastic surface, the outer stainless steel rim is now the main structural frame for the phone, and couples as two distinct antennas for the phone's myriad wireless technologies including 3G, GPRS (data), Wi-Fi and Bluetooth.

Apple has also upgraded the rear camera to a 5MP lens with a backlit sensor. This is important because it allows the camera to take better low-light pictures. It's also important to note that megapixels alone don't determine the quality of a phone's camera. There are 12MP phone cameras on the market, for example. It's more a combination of megapixels, the size of the sensor, and the software driving that camera that dictate the overall quality. Apple also added an LED flash to the camera and added a second, front-facing camera for taking pictures or use with their new FaceTime video conferencing feature.

Speaking of FaceTime, this was also announced as a new built-in video chatting feature on the phone. Though it only works today on Wi-Fi, it allows you to hit a button and chat via video with another iPhone 4 user. Other phones have had this feature already, but Apple seems to have done a great job making it as seamless as possible - you just hit the FaceTime button when dialing and wha-la, you're connected!

There are of course other new features like a gyroscope and the new iOS software, but we'll save some of the goodies for Dreux's presentation on the 19th. Until then, you can pre-order a new iPhone starting Tuesday, July 15th online and choose to pick it up at an Apple Store or have it shipped to you. Radio Shack, Best Buy and Walmart will also be carrying the phone at launch, but there's no guarantee as to your chances of snagging one.

not home all the time to sync and create backups of my iPhone on my personal MacBook at home. If I'm away from home for a few weeks on business and something happens, I want to be able to recover my emails, my contacts, and text message history without waiting until I travel back home (sometimes a week or two).

After discovering that there was no official way to sync my iPhone to multiple iTunes libraries, I did some searching, and found a workaround. While poking around, I inadvertently discovered that if you check (or uncheck) Encrypt iPhone Backup (on the iPhone's Summary tab in iTunes) that this forces iTunes to create a new backup of the iPhone (after you are prompted for password) -- even if it's not a phone that is normally synced with that library.

While I suppose that this could have certain security risks, it gives me the ability to force a backup. Of course it's a full backup, so it takes a few minutes, unlike the normal sequential backups that happen with a normal sync.

Should anything bad happen, I want to be sure I'm covered.



Call to order: 6:57 p.m. by President Matt Willmore, a quorum of voting members of the board being present.

MONTHLY REPORTS:

Secretary – Jim Connell: The minutes of the board meeting held on April 6, 2010, were unanimously approved as submitted.

Treasurer - Barbara Long: No report.

1_{st} Vice President – Programming – Doug Smith:

Doug Smith reported that Chuck Rogers from Tropical Software will make a presentation on TopXNotes at the Main Presentation for the May General Meeting. Doug has not heard from the makers of Drobo regarding a presentation at the June General Meeting and will contact Dreux Ste. Marie about being the speaker for the June General Meeting. Clair Jaschke reported that she has received the Quicken "Presentation in a Box" for use at a future General Meeting. The Programming Committee will continue to work on scheduling presenters for the rest of the year.

2nd **Vice President Facilities – Open:** Phil Booth reported that rent for the use of the Bellaire Civic Center is paid up through June. Due to work commitments, Phil will not be able to attend the May General Meeting but has made arrangements with the City of Bellaire to unlock and lock the building on May 15.

SIG Coordinator – Rick Roberts: Rick Roberts reported that since the current SIG schedule is working well, he plans no changes for the May General Meeting. He continues to plan on not scheduling SIGS after the Main Presentation.

Apple Barrel Editor- Open: No report.

Membership – David Jaschke: HAAUG had 210 members at the end of April 2010, an increase of three members from March 2010, and a decrease of six members from April 2009. Two new members joined HAAUG last month and two lapsed members renewed.

Webmaster – Jeff Davis: No report.

HAAUG Heaven Sysop - Open: No report.

OLD BUSINESS:

MacFest - Phil Booth: Phil Booth reported that the committee met last month and made assignments. Phil is considering the Holiday Inn Crowne Plaza at Kirby and the Southwest Freeway as a possible venue for the event. The committee will meet again on Tuesday, May 11, at Cafe Express in Uptown Park.

Lapsed Member Call List: David Jaschke will work with Barbara Long to generate a new list of lapsed members. David, Jim Connell and Matt Willmore will contact those on the new list about renewing their membership.

Public Address System: The board discussed the purchase of one of two possible public address systems: Anchor AN-130 (30 watts) at \$216.50 per unit for two units, or Anchor AN-1000X (50 watts) at \$443.83 per unit for two units. The board decided to defer a decision until the next board meeting.

HAAUG Hotline Alternate Services: IAPC is currently paying a monthly fee for the telephone service and billing HAAUG. The latest bill from IAPC shows a balance due, but Clair and David Jaschke reported that HAAUG is sending monthly checks to IAPC. David will work with Barbara Long to clear up the apparent billing discrepancy. The board decided to clarify with IAPC what the monthly billing includes, specifically whether it includes the telephone book listing, and to determine whether IAPC can be competitive with Ringcentral and Phone Booth.

Annual Payment to MacExperts: The board approved payment of an annual payment of \$100 to MacHighway for the web hosting service. The annual payment will result in a savings of \$20 over a monthly payment. David Jaschke reported that Barbara Long is investigating with HAAUG's bank the issuance of a credit card for HAAUG.

Programming Committee: Matt Willmore reported that the committee meetings to schedule future presentations are working well.

Web Operations Committee: Ed Truitt reported that he is working on scheduling the next meeting of the committee.

NEW BUSINESS:

Apple Barrel Committee Meeting Report: Matt Willmore reported that he, Tamara Alexander, Jim Connell and Ed Truitt met last week to discuss recommendations on improving the content and format of the Apple Barrel. The committee recommends to the board that the Apple Barrel be converted into an Internet blog, as a part of the redesign of HAAUG's presence on the Internet. The committee feels that a blog is a newer way of communicating. The blog format can be more easily and timely updated and will encourage more content from members. For the time being, the committee proposes that the blog entries for each month would be compiled into a newsletter in the current Pages/PDF format and distributed to the members by an email message. Eventually, with the transition to an ongoing blog, the committee expects that the by-laws would be amended to dispense with the requirement of a monthly newsletter.

Content for the May Apple Barrel: Matt Willmore requested that article for the May Apple Barrel be submitted by Saturday, May 8, so that the newsletter can be distributed to the membership that weekend.

May General Meeting: Matt Willmore reiterated that Chuck Rogers from Tropical Software will the speaker for the Main Presentation at the May General Meeting. He will present TopXNotes. Matt reported that MacExperts/ MacAmerica and Clear (Wi-Fi and Internet provider) would like to set up vendor tables in the lobby for the May General Meeting. After discussion, the board decided not to charge outside vendors for tables at this time, since having vendor tables at the General Meetings is an experiment at this time.

The board discussed requesting each attendee at the General Meetings to find one new member for HAAUG.


