The Swap Meet runs from 9am–2pm. We'll see you there!



HOWTO: Wipe your iPhone

So, you have received your shiny new Precioussss iPhone 4. It has been unboxed, activated, loaded with your songs, videos, photos, and apps. Now, you are ready to recoup some of the \$\$\$ you just spent by putting your old iPhone up on <u>eBay</u>, or <u>Craigslist</u>, or selling it at a <u>SwapMeet</u>.

Whoa, there, wait just a minute!

In addition to possibly being illegal (on account of the music, videos, and all that other copyrighted stuff), turning over your iPhone with all your email, contacts, and other personal information on it is just plain crazy. Which means that you have one more task to perform on your soon-to-be-former iPhone. That task: erase or "wipe" the phone, removing all your stuff from it, and preparing it for a new owner.

Great, you retort. But, how do I do make it so?

Well, that's where I come in. I will take you through the <u>steps that are documented on Apple's Support site</u>. With pictures. And, since I have gone through this myself, I can give you reasonable assurance that it will work!

So, are you ready? I said, ARE. YOU. READY?* Good, then let's get started!

(Note: by "ready", I also mean "your iPhone has a fully-charged battery, or is plugged in to a charger." This is really important, as the process will take awhile.)



Step 1: Go to the "Settings" screen. If you didn't move it, the icon will probably be found at the lower-right of your screen. Find the button, and press it.



Step 2: Go to the "General Settings" screen, by pressing the "General" button (circled).

QuickTip

The new camera capabilities of the iPhone 4 are much



improved from the earlier models. I wanted to separate my new iPhone 4 photos from the rest of my iPhone photo library within iPhoto and here's how you can do the same.

I have had every iPhone model since the original. Apple listed the camera model in the EXIF tags as Apple iPhone until the 3GS where they actually said Apple iPhone 3GS. With the iPhone 4, Apple has gone back to simply listing Apple iPhone. This makes it tricky to make a smart album for only iPhone 4 photos. Since the new iPhone 4 has a flash, we can use that metadata to create our iPhone 4 Smart Album. In iPhoto go to File » New Smart Album... and enter the follow settings in the dialog box.

- Match all of the following conditions:
- Camera Model is Apple iPhone
- Flash is not Unknown Here is a picture of what that should look like. This will place the imported iPhone 4 images uniquely within this Smart Album. [This will not work for images created by some of the photo apps, according to my testing... -Ed.]

Step 3: Scroll down to the bottom of the "General Settings" screen, locate the "Reset" button (circled), and press it.



Step 4: Find the button labeled "Erase all Content and Settings", which should be the second one from the top, and press it.



Step 5: You are almost there! You will now be presented with a red button labelled "Erase iPhone", and a warning that *this can't be undone*. **Press** the red button. You will get an "Are you sure?" confirmation screen. Press the button to confirm, and then set the iPhone down and let it do it's thing.



When it is finished, you will be presented with the following screen (should you try to power on your iPhone).

Congratulations! Your old iPhone is ready for sale!



HAAUG Board of Directors Meeting - Tuesday, June 1, 2010

Location: Industrial Audio/Video, Inc., 2617 Bissonnet Street, Houston, Texas.

Attendees: Philip Booth, Jim Connell, Michael Epstein, Clair Jaschke, David Jaschke, Barbara Long (via iChat), Rick Roberts, Doug Smith (via iChat), Ed Truitt (via iChat), Matt Willmore, and Greg Wright.

Call to order: 6:38 p.m. by President Matt Willmore, a quorum of voting members of the board being present.

MONTHLY REPORTS:

Secretary – Jim Connell: The minutes of the board meeting held on May 4, 2010, were unanimously approved as submitted.

Treasurer – Barbara Long: Barbara Long reported that HAAUG has approximately \$9,000 in the bank and that all bills she has received to date have been paid. She has confirmed with Charles at IAPC that HAAUG's account is current.

1st Vice President – Programming – Doug Smith: Doug Smith reported that the Programming Committee has arranged the following upcoming monthly meetings:

- June 19--New Apple products with Dreux Ste. Marie;
- July 17--Swap Meet;
- August 21--to be announced;
- September 18--Personal finance extravaganza/Photo Contest commences with judging on November 13;
- · October 2--MacFest;
- · October 16--iMovie and iLife;
- November 20--Digital camera buyer's guide and announcement of Photo Contest Winners;
- December 18--Election of officers, with Main Presentation to be announced.

2nd Vice President Facilities – Open: Phil Booth reported that HAAUG has paid rent to the City of Bellaire for use of Bellaire Civic Center through June 2010.

SIG Coordinator – Rick Roberts: Rick Roberts reported that no changes are planned for the SIG schedule for the June General Meeting.

Apple Barrel Editor- Open: No report.

Membership – David Jaschke: HAAUG had 205 members at the end of May 2010, a decrease of five members from April 2010. HAAUG had 212 members at the end of May 2009. One new member joined HAAUG last month and two members renewed their membership.

Webmaster – Jeff Davis: Jeff Davis reported by email that everything is working well.

HAAUG Heaven Sysop - Open: Matt Willmore reported that there were two new registrations last month.

OLD BUSINESS:

MacFest - Phil Booth: Phil Booth reported that the committee met last month. October 2 is the tentative date for this year's MacFest. Phil visited two more hotels as possible meeting sites and has received quotes from the Sheraton (\$1,500) and Holiday Inn Select (\$1,200) for meeting rooms. He will get a quote from the Intercontinental Hotel.

Lapsed Member Call List: Matt Willmore reported that Barbara Long is working on a second list of lapsed members.

Public Address System: Phil Booth sent out new proposals for a portable sound system for use at HAAUG's meetings. The system will cost about \$900 in round numbers. Greg Wright submitted cost figures for a Fender system that would be adequate for HAAUG. IAV's system includes a wireless microphone, which would need to be purchased as an extra accessory with the Fender system. After discussion, the board approved, with one abstention, spending up to \$1,000 for a new portable public address system.

HAAUG Hotline Alternate Services: HAAUG will try PhoneBook for one month as a test of an alternative for the current HAAUG Hotline.

Web Operations Committee: The committee will meet on Wednesday, June 2, at 6:30 p.m. at the Black Labrador Pub to discuss HAAUG's total web presence. Matt requested that iChat participation in the meeting by text only. Ed Truitt has begun an inventory of HAAUG's web operations.

NEW BUSINESS:

Content for the June Apple Barrel: Matt Willmore requested that articles for this month's Apple Barrel be submitted by June 6. As always, content for the newsletter would be appreciated. Matt reported that work is underway to move the Apple Barrel to a blog format, as a part of the overall reorganization of HAAUG's web presence.

June General Meeting: For the Main Presentation at this month's meeting, Dreux Ste. Marie will discuss Apple's new products, including the iPhone 4, iOS 4, and the iPad. MacExperts, MacAmerica and Clear may have vendor tables in the lobby at this month's meeting.

Swap Meet Registration: Matt Willmore has asked Tamara Alexander to put a link for table reservations on the website. Phil Booth will handle the table reservations.

IRS Returns for 501(c) organizations: The deadline for 501(c) organizations to file a tax return is June 30. Phil says HAAUG is a 501(c)(6) organization. He will look for the incorporation papers. Doug Smith will contact a relative, who is a CPA, about the requirement to file a tax return.

Audit of 2009 Financial Records: Barbara Long reported that the books have not closed for 2009. Once the books have closed, an audit will be conducted.

Matt Willmore announced that he has accepted a new job in Indiana and will be moving in about six weeks. Doug Smith will assume the position of president upon Matt's departure. The board members expressed thanks Matt for his many contributions to HAAUG as a board member and officer and wished him success in his new job.

iPhone 4: First Impressions

Shortly after Apple introduced the new iPhone I checked my upgrade status with AT&T and found that I could purchase the new phone at the subsidized rate. On the day that Apple and AT&T allowed pre-orders I tried like millions of others to order the phone. I got nowhere like millions of others, until the evening when Apple offered a reservation for store pick-up, on the day the phone was released. My only comment about the process is that folks there should have been more planning. The corporations involved should have should have remembered the demand for the previous release of iPhones.

Reservation in hand I went to the Galleria Apple store mentally prepared for chaos. The chaos was the traffic in and around the Galleria. The situation at the store was calm; there were two lines one for folks like me with reservations, and the other for walk-ups. I got in the reservation line with only about six folks ahead of me. After a store employee verified that I had a reservation, people from both lines were metered into the jammed store. I was pointed to a free sales person and with no problems I had the new phone. I was pointed to another store employee to activate the phone, and I was done. I estimate that I was in the Galleria for about forty-five minutes.

I came home and backed up my old phone and restored the new phone from the back up. I now had a new iPhone 4. I upgraded from an iPhone 3G, and the difference was amazing. I noticed that a game that I play a lot was faster and more responsive. I have also found that the display is as good as advertised. Watching video on the phone is fantastic. There has been some discussion about the new phone's battery life, with some pundits saying that the battery does not last long enough. I don't know about the phones that they were using but I watched a two-hour movie, part of another and played a game during a recent

flight and still had a charge when I reached my destination. I nicked-named my old phone "She who must be recharged," so this non-scientific study shows that the battery seems to last longer.

The new version of the iPhone OS now called iOS has some new features that make the phone easier to use. The folders feature lets you organize your applications so you are not paging through multiple screens trying to find your tip calculator. I have experienced the "multi-tasking" which is really a suspend and restart, when the phone rang while I was playing a game. The game restarted at the same position when I took the call. I have not tried FaceTime as I do not know anyone that has an iPhone 4 but I hope to soon, The new camera is really great.

The Antenna issue is now raging in the tech press, all of the antennas the phone needs are formed using the metal rim that surrounds phone. There are reports that holding the phone in a certain way degrades the 3G data signal. I don't know if I saw it but I was down loading some e-mail, and saw what looked like a speed increase when I removed my finger from the bottom of the phone, where 3G antenna is located. Some tech writers say that you have to hold the phone in a "Death Grip" to see the effect. I am not an antenna engineer so I really can't comment. To be safe purchase a case or a band so that you are not touching the antennas, when you are using the phone.

I have only had the phone less than a month, so I have hardly explored all of the features of the device or the OS. Most of the changes to the OS were directed at developers to allow them to create applications with more features and we will see those coming soon.

Except for the ordering snafu I have had a good experience with the phone.


