

### Book Review - Mac OS X Snow Leopard: The Missing Manual

Earlier this year, I received a copy of David Pogue's <u>Mac OS X Snow Leopard: The Missing Manual</u> (Pogue Press/O'Reilly, 2009) for review. After using it to help me with an upgrade to Snow Leopard on my MacBook, as well as with the initial setup on my MacBook Pro (acquired after I accidentally destroyed the MacBook while trying to swap out the hard drive), I think I have enough experience with the book to be able to comment on it intelligently.

To start out, let's put a myth to rest: despite what it says on the cover, the *only* way I want this book in the box with my new Mac is if it is on CD-ROM. At 885 pages (including index), this book is way too thick to fit in the existing packaging. Which is, in a way, a *good thing*: after all, as a comprehensive reference on the what makes Snow Leopard what it is (and how to use all that to your advantage), there is simply too much information to fit in a smaller book (at least, not without reducing the font size to the point that a magnifying glass would be needed in order to read it.)

This is also not a work you would sit down and read, cover-to-cover (although I tried.) Rather, it is meant to sit on your bookshelf, waiting for the day you are scratching your head, trying to figure out (or remember) how to do something that isn't particularly intuitive (yes, I know that OS X, like all Apple products, are designed to be intuitive by nature - but let's just say that nothing's perfect. That's why we need manuals. And HOWTOs. and FAQs. And support forums. And User Groups.) Even so, there is some good general information available, for those who want to go beyond "what can you do" or "how do you do something", and dig deeper into the technologies behind Snow Leopard.

The book is laid out to support this type of usage, organized logically into sections that start with now to work with the basics of the user interface, proceeding to the different programs and components of the OS, then to the underlying technologies, then winding up with how to interact with the online world using OS X. Last but not least, the appendices are nowhere near as useless as the similarly-named human appendages: I find myself going to *Appendix E* (the master list of secret keystrokes) quite often, in fact (while the author suggests you clip it and post it to your monitor - unless you borrowed the book from the library - I would suggest a Quick Reference card be provided. After all, many of us take our Macs with us, and this book really is too big to travel well.) For others, the appendix on Troubleshooting, or the "Dictionary" that is aimed at helping Windows users with figuring out the Mac equivalents, may prove equally popular.

This is definitely not a book for the coffee table. However, it is one I would recommend without reservation for Mac users, regardless of their level of expertise. Every time I pick it up, I learn something new (and I've been doing IT professionally for 30+ years.) And, while it's true that you can find almost anything with Google, there are sometimes (like, for example, when your Internet connection is down) when having the information at your fingertips can be a real hair-saver.

(Disclosure: I received a free copy of this book via <u>HAAUG</u> for review.)

### QuickTip

Apple made it quite easy and intuitive to quit out of apps in iOS 4; however I have not seen this method mentioned anywhere.

Double tap the Home button to bring up the multitasking applications view, then tap and hold on an app (as if you were arranging your home screen). A small red circle will appear on each app; tap one to close that app. And, of course, you can still swipe through the list to see more.



### QuickTip

To the best of my knowledge, no third-party PDF plugin on the Mac allows for the inline viewing of PDFs in Google Chrome, fortunately there is a way. As of Chrome 6, Google bundles an experimental PDF plugin, which is disabled by default.

#### To enable it:

- Type about:plugins in the omnibox.
- You should see a disabled plugin called 'Chrome PDF Viewer;' click the Enable button under this plugin.

You should now be able to view PDFs in Chrome. There are a few rough edges to this plugin. The occasional PDF will not display properly (in particular, it seems to choke on PDFs that have restrictions in effect — printing, copying, etc), but the vast majority show up just fine. The viewer is very fast, and has resizing controls available in the bottom-right corner of the window.

Note that there is currently no loading indicator for PDFs, so if you click on a large document, it may seem like the tab has frozen, but it is in fact just the PDF loading silently.

[crarko adds: I tested this, and it works as described. It was fine with the couple of PDFs I tried.]


