

# Have an iPad? Need to backup photos from your camera? There's an Acc(essory) for that!

Right about the start of the post-Thanksgiving shopping season, a friend of mine had to go to the Apple store to have her iPhone un-bricked. She was debating picking up an iPad, and an offhand comment from me sent her over the edge:

"I love my iPad. Be sure and buy the big one - 64 GB is GREAT for backing up photos!"

It turns out that she is (a) an avid traveller, and (b) an avid photographer. The ability to backup the photos she takes (even the ones taken in RAW) was what "made the sale."

Now, the iPad won't do this all by itself. It takes the addition of an accessory, the iPad Camera Connection Kit (\$29.00 at the Apple Store.) The kit comes with two connectors: one has a USB port for connecting a camera (or your iPhone, and it will also support some other USB devices), while the other has a slot for an SD/SDHC card. The images are imported into the iPad's "Photo" app, where they are available for viewing or editing (yes, "there's an App for that, too!")

The Camera Connection Kit really increases the utility of the iPad for the photographer. The ability to use the iPad both as an image storage device, as well as an image editing device, eliminates two of the major reasons that photographers (*this* photographer, at least!) take laptops with them when they travel.

OK, I'll admit: when I travel on business, I will almost always take a Company-owned laptop with me. In the past, I would also take my own personal laptop, because my employer is somewhat sticky about storing personal media files on Company-owned equipment, and installing personal software is a definite no-no. So, this will only eliminate *one* laptop. Well, one laptop, and all those funny stares from the TSA screeners at the airport, who for some reason didn't always understand the reason I had multiple laptops with me.

Another benefit to the Connection Kit: by being able to hook my iPhone up, and transfer photos from it to the iPad, I don't miss the lack of a camera on the iPad nearly so much. Besides, have you ever tried to hand-hold an 8x10 view camera? I have, and it isn't a lot of fun. Nor does it make for very sharp photos. The iPad may be a great tool for a number of purposes, but I am thinking that it would make a *lousy* camera. Just saying.

So, if the photographer on your Christmas list has an iPad, and you are looking for that special something to put in their stocking (or under their tree), check out the iPad Camera Connection Kit. Of course, if they don't have an iPad...

#### QuickTip

Recently, I was asked to find a way to delete the 'Where From' link in the Get Info box of the Finder, because the info key was too incriminating. I didn't want to download any software, so I set about looking in the file's metadata. After running *mdIs* and *xattr* on the file, I finally hit upon a way to delete the key.

If you run xattr on your downloaded file, like this:

#### xattr /Path/To/File

You'll get a key named com.apple.metadata:kMDltemWher eFroms. To delete this key in the Terminal, run:

xattr -d com.apple.metadata:kMDItemWher eFroms /Path/To/File

I knew I would have to do this often, so instead of running a shell script every time I wanted to strip the Where From, I wrote an AppleScript:

on deleteWhereFrom(fileToClean) trv

set posixPath to quoted form of POSIX path of fileToClean

do shell script "xattr -d

com.apple.metadata.kMDltemWher eFroms " & posixPath end try end deleteWhereFrom on open imgs repeat with i in imgs deleteWhereFrom(i) end repeat end open on run set imgs to choose file with

set imgs to choose file with multiple selections allowed repeat with i in imgs deleteWhereFrom(i) end repeat end run

I then saved it on the desktop as an application. Now, I can drag and drop as a batch operation to delete the metadata key.



- Select some messages in Mail.
- Run the script from the Scripts Menu.
- The script will create a new document in TextEdit containing the messages, which you can edit further, save, etc.


