The SIGs will start at 9am and the Main Presentation begins at 11:15. We'll see you there on the 19th!










# **Boss HAAUG Speaks**

Monthly Address from the HAAUG President





Dear HAAUG,

As I mentioned above, Apple reported its fiscal 4th quarter results last month. "The Company posted quarterly revenue of \$28.27 billion and quarterly net profit of \$6.62 billion, or \$7.05 per diluted share. These results compare to revenue of \$20.34 billion and net quarterly profit of \$4.31 billion, or \$4.64 per diluted share, in the year-ago quarter." Anyway you look at it, that is a lot of money. There was some disappointment from the analyst community that Apple did not break their (the analysts) estimates on results, even though the quarter did exceed the guidance that Apple gave at the last quarterly report.

#### Apple reported sales of:

- 17.07 million iPhones:
- 11.12 million iPads;
- 4.89 million Macintosh computer systems; and
- 6.62 million iPods

All but the iPods showed sales increases from the fourth guarter of last year.

I want to thank the members who were in attendance at the October meeting for approving the changes to the club's By-Laws. I feel that these changes will help with the running of the organization in the future. At the October Board meeting the budget committee presented the 2012 budget to the board. After some good questions and explanations the board voted to present the budget to the members in December for their approval. As usual the budget committee was very conservative on the revenue projections. Although we can always use increased revenue from new members, for the last three years the club has benefited from reductions in our internet/communications and meeting costs. These cost savings have resulted in the club having a surplus.

At the November meeting, Houston Chronicle technology columnist Dwight Silverman will present his thoughts on OSX 10.7 Lion. Apples new cat has many changes that have even long term users scratching their heads. For my part, I had an easy time upgrading to Lion, but upgrading to iOS 5 was a long painful process. For a time I thought that I had a bricked phone, but it did make it back and is working fine.

### The ölloclip Lens System for iPhone 4/4S

It is often said that "the best camera is the one you carry with you."

Given how many people are carrying their iPhone with them, and given that the iPhone 4 is the most popular camera on Flickr (and, even more surprising, the iPhone and iPod Touch models comprise 4 out of 5 most popular camera phones), it is apparent that the iPhone is the camera of choice for many.



And, why shouldn't it be? The camera in the iPhone 4 is quite capable (and the one in the iPhone 4S is reportedly even more so), it can capture both still photos and video clips, and if you need (or want) special effects/features not provided by the basic camera, in many cases "there's an app for that"! And, with iOS 5, the "Volume Up" button takes on the additional function of a shutter button!

One thing it's hard to create an app for, however, is an attachable lens. And, like many of its point-and-shoot cousins, the iPhone has mostly been limited to the lens that came with the device. This was especially true for the iPhone 4, which has a smooth glass faceplate over the lens which doesn't lend itself to mounting additional hardware.

#### Enter the <u>olloclip</u>.

The brainchild of Patrick O'Neill, the olloclip was made possible thanks to crowd-sourced funding through <u>Kickstarter</u>. It is a small clip-on attachment that fits over the corner of the iPhone 4 or 4S, and sits on top of the rearfacing camera. It is actually three lenses in one package, containing a fisheye, a wide angle, and a macro lens (the macro lens is exposed by unscrewing the wide angle lens from the mount.) It comes in red and black (there is no other difference between the two), and a lens cap is provided for each end.



Attaching the olloclip is very simple to do. First, remove the iPhone from the case (the makers couldn't ensure the attachment would work properly with the large number of cases on the market, so they chose to size it to make a snug fit over the iPhone without a case. This really makes sense, as the thickness of the case would throw off the calculations needed to make the lens focus properly.) Then, power the iPhone on (the attachment covers the power switch), slide the olloclip over the corner, with the lens desired on top of the built-in rearward facing lens. Then, remove the lens cap, fire up your favorite camera app, and snap away!





HAAUG Board of Directors Meeting – Saturday, September 17, 2011

**Location:** Bellaire Civic Center, 7008 South Rice Avenue, Bellaire, Texas.

**Attendees:** Philip Booth, Jim Connell, Michael Epstein, Clair Jaschke, David Jaschke, Michael King, Rick Roberts, Doug Smith, Ed Truitt, and Greg Wright.

**Call to order:** 1:23 p.m. by President Philip Booth, a quorum of voting members of the board being present.

**General Announcments:** Philip Booth thanked those who helped set up yesterday afternoon for today's General Meeting and who arranged for speaker for the Main Presentation.

#### **MONTHLY REPORTS:**

**Secretary – Open:** The minutes of the board meeting held on August 20, 2011, were unanimously approved as submitted to the board.

**Treasurer – Clair Jaschke:** Clair Jaschke submitted written financial reports for August 2011 to the board. As of the end of last month, HAAUG had \$11,013.63 in its bank account. The financial reports were unanimously approved as submitted to the board. Clair announced that the financial records for 2009 and 2010 are ready to be audited. How does it work? I really, really like it. My favorite lens in the fisheye, and I have used it to make some very artistic images. I have also used the macro lens, although in order to take proper advantage of it, I will need a small tripod with a head that will hold the iPhone.

So, if you want something more flexible than your iPhone 4/4S, but your Christmas budget won't allow for a new camera, this may be a cost-effective solution . #### QuickTip

This may not be so much a hint as a caveat.



I was thrilled to discover iOS 5.0 now allows repeating reminders until I discovered that while the iOS software (such as that on the iPad) allows repeating reminders, iCal and iCloud still DO NOT.

So, if you create a repeating reminder you need to make sure you check it off on your iOS device and NOT on iCloud or iCal — doing so checks off the task and removes it. Checking it off on the iOS device marks it as done for that day and then automatically creates the task again at the specified repeat interval.

[crarko adds: I haven't tested this one. The hint submitter didn't mention the version of iCal being used, so if that makes any difference please note so in the comments. I'm certainly willing to believe iCloud is still undergoing improvement, and maybe this is an issue which will be corrected.]

#### QuickTip

One of the benefits of iCloud is that your photos will automatically be

synchronized from your iPhone, iPod Touch, or iPad to your other supported and associated devices.

However, what if you don't want a photo automatically synched when you take it? For example, you might want to make some adjustments to the image before making it available on your other devices , where others might see it.

You can do this easily, by taking the photo in an app like Camera+. When you take the photo in Camera+, the image is stored in the app's internal data store ("light table"). It won't be written to the camera roll until/unless you save it from within the app. This will keep iCloud from synching it, until you are ready.


