The SIGs start at 9am, and the Main Presentation begins at 11:00. We'll see you there on the 15th!





Boss HAAUG Speaks

Monthly Address from the HAAUG President

Last month I wished everyone a happy
Thanksgiving. Today I wish you Happy Holidays and
a happy New Year. This was a great year for HAAUG,
with the quality of our programing improved, and our finances and
membership count stabilized.

Claire Jaschke and the Audit Committee went through the last three years of finance records, and the committee pronounced our finances in good shape. Your Board takes management of the club's money very seriously. I was a member of the board when there was a real possibility that we would need to end operations. Several years ago, the club was spending large sums of money for Internet hosting and meeting costs. We have cut those expenses significantly, and this year we were able to put \$5,000 in a Certificate of Deposit. We were able to finance the appearance of MacWorld Sr. Editor Chris Breem at the October meeting, and are planning to bring more national speakers to HAAUG in the coming year.

Dear HAAUG,

Membership Chair David Jaschke can now convert visitors to members using his iPhone and the club's Square account. Squareup.com is a mobile payment service that uses iOS devices to accept credit cards. Since the club subscribed to the Square system we have enrolled at least 15 new members and untold number of member renewals just because we could accept credit cards at meetings.

The Main Presentations this year have been the best with Bob LeVitus, Dwight Silverman and Chris Breem being the high lights. This coming year we plan to continue bringing top-notch speakers to the membership. Greg Wright did an outstanding job in organizing this years main presentations.

Ed Truitt put up with me just hitting the deadline to get this column to him so the Apple Barrel could be published on time. He also writes the monthly security column, as well as other content for the Apple Barrel. In his spare time, he and Tamara Alexander keep www.haaug.org up and operating.

"Tis the season to go shopping..."

And, from reports on Black Friday and Cyber Monday activities, online shopping is continuing to gain in popularity. There are several reasons for this: the selection of goods available online is extensive, turning your Mac or iDevice into a super-store fit to rival the big boxes; prices are competitive with those offered by the brick-and-mortar storefronts (even taking into consideration the fact that Amazon.com, one of the larger online retailers, began charging Texas sales tax in July); and most online retailers are open for perusal 24x7 (even if, like B&H Photo/Video, they don't take orders during certain religious or other holidays.)

Besides, who wants to be out in public during the <u>mass psychosis known as "Black Friday Madness"</u>? And who wants to spend most of Thanksgiving week participating in the "<u>Black Friday Campout</u>"?

OK, so we have established that there are very good and valid reasons for doing our holiday shopping online, rather than going from store to store to store to store to store to store to store... However, that doesn't mean that this activity is totally without a downside. Even though more employers are OK with shopping on company equipment, most of those employer-owned PCs run Microsoft Windows and Internet Explorer. Given its track record, I for one am loathe to use IE for online shopping, or in fact for any activity that asks me to provide credit card or other financial information. However, even for us Apple *aficionados*, there are risks to shopping online. Let's examine a few of them, along with ways to minimize the chance of becoming victims.

Shop at reputable retailers. This is just as true online as it is when visiting a brick-and-mortar store. There are many fly-by-night operators who are willing to separate you from your holiday shopping \$\$\$, and the cost of setting up a storefront is a lot less when all you need is a web site. Note that this isn't the same as "shop at *major* retailers": a mom-and-pop shop, that you know and have trust, can be every bit as safe as one of the mega retailers.

If it sounds too good to be true... it probably is. One of the big draws of online shopping is lower prices. Scammers take advantage of this, offering ridiculously low prices on goods. Unfortunately, once they have your money, you are likely to find that either (1) they don't have the goods, or (2) the goods they are selling are poor quality, or counterfeit, or (more likely) both.

Be wary of links - "think before you click." There are many ways the bad guys can try to trick you into clicking on their link: from using domains which are close to legitimate sites (e.g. "amason.com" instead of "amazon.com"), to presenting a link whose actual URL isn't the same as the one you are reading, to the use of "link shorteners" (e.g. "bit.ly") which hide the actual name of the site from your prying eyes. If you are unsure, go to the retailer's web site by typing it in your browser bar

QuickTip

Sometimes, such as early this week, Apple's iMessages servers



go down. If so, and you try to send iMessages, you may want to resend those messages as standard text messages or SMSs. OS X Daily had a nice hint about how to do so easily. After you've sent the iMessage, if you see that it's not delivered, or if you simply want to use a beltand-suspenders approach to make sure your recipient gets your message, just tap and hold on the blue bubble containing the message text, then choose Send as Text Message. It will get sent as a text message, and you can tell this by the green text bubble.

For this to work, you have to have your contact's phone number in their card. However, if you only have an email address for that contact, tapping and holding the text bubble shows Send to Email Address. In my tests, this failed every time, so I'm not exactly sure how this is supposed to work. (I assume that it would try and send the message as an email...) If anyone can get this to work, please post in the comments.



If you are using a wireless network, use a secure one. Avoid "open" WiFi networks for shopping or any activity you want to keep private. And, WEP isn't much better. Look for a network with WPA or WPA2 encryption. If you can't find one, wait to make that purchase until you can.

Angry Birds Seasons: 2012 Holiday Calendar

One of the things i enjoyed as a youngster (and that I enjoyed sharing with Son when *he* was young) was the annual Advent calendar. Each day, a new door would open, revealing its contents to wondering eyes.

As we at the point where Son is grown but there are not yet grandkids to spoil, the traditional Advent calendar has (temporarily) lost its place on the shelf. However, I still yearned for something that would help re-create the feeling of daily anticipation I remember from years ago.









Scenes from Angry Birds Seasons HD

Thanks to the folks at Apple and Rovio, I have it.

I'll admit, I have been a fan of Angry Birds since the first game came out. It was a bit tricky to play on the iPhone, especially for large-fingered individuals like myself. However, I like the challenge of figuring out exactly where to place the birds where they'll do the most damage. And, the game designers at Rovio have been busy coming up with new ways to keep the paradigm interesting. One of their creations is Angry Birds Seasons (HD), which provides a series of levels themed on different holidays throughout the year. And, guess what they offer for the Christmas season?

That's right: an Advent calendar!

It works like the traditional Advent calendar: each day, a new level is "unlocked" for play. You get the normal cast of Angry Birds and Bad Piggies, with the pigs decked out in elf or Santa hats instead

of military-style headgear. In line with the winter theme, there is also snow present, which tends to reduce the destructive effects of the various birds. I have also noticed that with this particular game, it is much more difficult to get the "three star" scores which is necessary to open up the extra levels.

However, those are minor nits. It is an Advent calendar, it fits on the iPad, and it provides me my daily dose of Angry Birds destruction!

Angry Birds is available as a free (ad-supported) download from the iTunes App Store, though I recommend you pony up \$0.99 for the iPhone version, or \$2.99 for the HD version which is optimized for the iPad.
