

Boss HAAUG Speaks

Monthly Address from the HAAUG President



Welcome to Summer! The rainy season has departed and we are in the grips of a heat wave. HĀAUG had the July swap meet; some of the folk selling did very well but it could have been better if more folks showed up. If you have some things that could be sold the next chance will be in January.

Apple announced the "June" quarter results and the company sold a lot of iPhones and Mac's. Here are the numbers according to Apple's press release: "The Company posted quarterly revenue of \$49.6 billion and quarterly net profit of \$10.7 billion, or \$1.85 per diluted share." What got some folks upset was that Apple did not announce the number of watches that they sold. Apple also declared a dividend of \$0.52 per share. What amazed some people was that Apple stock dropped in price the next day. Some people said that is was profit taking for the quarter.

Closer to home a committee of the board examined the 2014 financial records and pronounced them in good order. While it is not the kind of audit that a CPA would do it was a second set of eyes that looked over the transactions and found nothing out of the ordinary. Because we trimmed our meeting and Internet costs your organization has in round numbers \$15,000 in the bank. This is despite an level membership of about 150. Your board is very prudent with the club's funds.

Apple also announced that "normal folks" could download Beta version of OS 10.11 and iOS 9 but were strongly cautioned to put them on a second machine or a spare partition and not run it as your everyday OS. This is a chance for non-developers to kick the tires and send in bug reports. These are not fully formed OSes and there will be a lot of bugs and a lot of programs will not function. Tread cautiously.

We still have the raffle for the \$500 Apple Gift card that you can use to buy an Apple Watch. One chance is \$5.00, five chances are \$20.00. The drawing will be at the September meeting and you do not need to be present to win. You will need to pick up the prize at the meeting. We will be selling chances up to the drawing.

We are scheduled to have Dwight Silverman at the August meeting. He will discuss Internet providers in Houston. This will be a chance to evaluate your current provider and see if you want to make a change. In September Reagan Atkinson of Houston Camera Exchange will talk on the new products in Photography. Mark your calendars for August 15, and September 19th for the next HAAUG Meetings.

I write and talk about this like beating a dead horse but the HAAUG Election is around the corner and now is the time to think about becoming a member of the board. The club could use a jolt of new ideas.



BOD Minutes

June 20, 2015

Location: Bellaire Civic Center, 7008 South Rice Avenue, Bellaire, Texas

Attendees: Phil Booth, David Jaschke, Clair Jaschke, Jack Adair, Mike King, Mike Epstein, Ryan Eisworth

Call to Order: By President Phil Booth at 12:58 PM following the conclusion of the June General Meeting.

General Announcements: Phil thanked every one for the work done last month, and for their attendance today.

Monthly Reports

Secretary - Jack Adair: Minutes of the May BOD meeting were approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report - Clair Jaschke: Clair reported that our checking account balance as of the end of May was \$3,939.79. Our savings account balance was \$10,002.41, for total cash on hand of \$13,942.20. The Apple Gift Card for the "Apple Watch" raffle was purchased from the checking account. We got an E-mail from Jeff Davis with an invoice to get the haaug. org domain name active. This is different from what we pay MacHighways every month. Most bills have been paid, and all funds have been deposited.

Programming Report: Phil reported that we have the Swap Meet next month. Dwight Silverman expressed a willingness to come back and give his presentation. We will try to get him in August. Phil would like to get either Bob LeVitus for September (which would require a plane ticket), or Andrew Cunningham, the Mac editor from ArsTechnica, which would involve a Skype call. Reagan Atkinson from Houston Camera Exchange would also be a possibility for September; Clair recommended we consider him first for September due to his time constraints. Dave Hamilton is also interested in coming if we get him an airplane ticket. Here are the goals:

August: Dwight Silverman September: Reagan Atkinson

October: Bob LeVitus or Andrew Cunningham

November: Dave Hamilton

No discussions were held on SIGs this month.

Membership - David Jaschke: Dave reported that we ended the month of May with 142 members, which was down by one from April, and down from 151 members (a difference of 9 members) from May 31, 2014. We had much better membership activity in May, with a total of 10 transactions for the month. One

of these was by credit card and four by KAGI. We had two twoyear renewals.

HAAUG Electronic Communications Systems - Ryan Eisworth:

Ryan reported that we have the latest Apple Barrel published, including the ad about the Apple Watch raffle. There is a page on the Website discussing the raffle. The two admins for Facebook are Matt Willmore (who is now the Mac guy at Notre Dame) and Tamara Alexander. The link to the HAAUG Website on the Facebook page goes to a non-existent page. The Swap Meet banner is already on the HAAUG Website and the Web form is working. Ryan is also interested in putting some general advertising for HAAUG on the Facebook page. We probably need to look at changing the ownership of the account.

New Business

Audit: The audit was held this morning, with Phil Booth, Mike King, and Jack Adair auditing the statements for 2014. The books were found to be in good order - our treasurer does a great job. There are a couple of open items from last year's audit: (a) a manual to be produced so that another person could hop into Clair's spot and avoid a huge learning curve, and (b) getting a cloud-based holding for the financial data base. Clair has accomplished that via a Dropbox account. Also, Phil reported that we have no central repository for the passwords for the Dropbox account or for the E-mail account. We need to figure out a method for doing this. Mike King suggested LastPass because that info is kept in the cloud. Phil suggested that these passwords for the LastPass account be placed in an envelope and passed to the Secretary in the event that they are needed. LastPass is free for the Mac only, and \$9.00 per year for iOS. Mike also reported that LastPass has two-step authentication. Phil will investigate this further, at which point we need to gather the credentials and get this taken care of.

Phil will contact our proposed upcoming presenters between now and the Swap Meet.
