


Last Minute Holiday Shopping

Product Announcement

Patina Fills Need for Simple Drawing App for Mac

Fountain Valley, California—Mac users in search of a simple drawing app now have an appealing option in a polished but low cost newly launched program called Patina. Developed by a California company called Atek, Patina echoes the simplicity of Microsoft Paint, the widely used goto drawing tool for generations of Windows users, a nd goes further with a more visually appealing interface and additional functionality.

Patina sports a modern and slick appearance, with large tool buttons and color controls. Although more stylish in appearance than Paint, Patina shares the simple feel of Microsoft's popular app. Basic operations, such as drawing and manipulating shapes, setting and changing colors, moving and resizing objects, and doing annotations, are all very straightforward.

Patina's functionality surpasses that of Paint in a number of ways. For example, objects can be rotated at any angle rather than being limited to specific degrees of rotation. Other enhanced features include transparent image saving and a convenient slider for controlling a variety of app functions, such as tool stroke thickness and text font size.

According to Atek company president Dan Rothman, "Many people who have switched over from Windows to Mac love Apple hardware and software but miss Microsoft Paint for doing simple drawings. We evaluated drawing apps for Mac that were currently available and found they were either unrefined open source programs or complex vector applications for designers and artists. There were no OS X apps that could match the userfriendliness of Paint. We aimed to fill that void with Patina."

Rothman added: "With all kinds of people now using Apple computers, unlike in the past when most users were design professionals, the time is right for there to be a simple, userfriendly drawing app for all types of Mac users to enjoy, including adults, students, and children."

Patina, which is currently offered for free on promotion in the Mac App Store through December 9, 2015, opens with a tutorial screen that points out the main features of the app and makes it easy to start using it.

Pricing and Availability:

Patina 1.0, which is optimized for Retina Display, is available worldwide exclusively through the Mac App Store in the Graphics & Design category for \$2.99 (free upon launch on promotion through December 9, 2015 only).

Editor's note: While the developer's press release states that the free promotion for Patina is though December 9 only, Patina was still free on the Mac App Store at the time of publication (December 15).

October 17, 2015

Location: Bellaire Civic Center, 7008 South Rice Avenue, Bellaire, Texas

Call to Order: By President Phil Booth at 12:36 PM following the conclusion of the October General Meeting.

General Announcements: We persevered despite the issues with the Bellaire Fire Department fire truck pull that significantly decreased our attendance this month. Phil expressed his appreciation to the "First Impressions for OS X El Capitan" panel as well as the HAAUG Trivia Challenge participants.

Monthly Reports

Secretary - Jack Adair: Minutes of the September BOD meeting were approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report - Clair Jaschke: Clair reported that our checking account balance as of the end of September was \$4,797.00. Our savings account balance was \$10,002.74, for total cash on hand of \$14,799.74. All bills have been paid, and all funds have been deposited for September.

Programming Report: Phil got no response from ArsTechnica for a presentation for October, so he organized the "First Impressions for OS X El Capitan" panel discussion and the HAAUG Trivia Challenge. We have confirmed Bob LeVitus for the November 21 meeting to discuss Mac OS X El Capitan. However, Bob indicated he would be reluctant to come back as soon as February 2016, which is when he does his customary "State of Apple" address.

We have an issue with the November meeting due to a Bellaire High School Fun Run on November 21. The question was: should we use the Civic Center venue despite the issues with closing down Rice Ave.? The likely best option is a change of venue to the Embassy Suites if possible, in that we need a venue with suitable parking with Bob LeVitus coming. The Board voted to approve a maximum expenditure of \$1,500.00 for rental expenses, but the location is still to be determined. Phil will work this issue next Friday.

The planned December 19 meeting is a Christmas shopping idea meeting, hopefully led by Doug Smith, with the rest of the board members able to participate if Doug is not available.

Wi-Fi Subscription Issue: The Bellaire WiFi was much better today. Phil will check out the cost of WiFi for the November meeting at our selected venue.

Possible Projector Purchase: The board unanimously approved a motion to spend up to \$2000 for a new projector.
