

SIGs start at 9:00 am and the Main Presentation begins at 11:00 am. We hope to see everyone there!





Monthly Address from the HAAUG President

Our favorite fruit company was in the news recently for the wrong reasons. Instead of announcing new product, it is embroiled in a controversy with the FBI. The government through a court order is demanding that Apple write software that will allow the FBI to search the phone of the San Bernardino gunman. The company's position is that that software does not exist and they do not want to be forced to create a system that will allow the company to unlock the iPhone making iPhones less secure.

This is an interesting case as the FBI has a legitimate need to inspect the contents of the phone to see if the shooter had communication with other people that could be planning some kind of operation. Another aspect to this story is that the iPhone in question was issued to the gunman by his employer the San Bernardino County.

Apple has touted the security of the iPhone, saying over and over again that they do not want to collect their customer's data. This case will test whether our phones, which hold more personal information than we realize, will be open to law enforcement and people who get their hands on the keys. This is something that we all need to watch.

A very large thanks to Ryan Eisworth for his presentation on the System Preferences in OS X. I hope that we can do more deep dives into the Apple OS's. Members of the Board met and planned the year and I think that it looks good. # Why it Pays to Attend HAAUG Meetings

### Why It Can Pay to Attend a HAAUG Meeting

After several months' absence, I attended last month's HAAUG General Meeting—and am I glad I did!

Ryan Eisworth devoted the Main Presentation to an in-depth review of System Preferences, an OS X feature that all Mac users access from time to time. Ryan showed functions in System Preferences that I did not know existed—functions that enable the user to customize the Mac the way he or she likes it.

For several weeks prior to the meeting I had been experiencing a printing issue on my mid-2010 iMac. This is the first problem I've ever experienced with it.

When the issue began, I would click "print' in an application and nothing would happen. Clicking on "Printers & Scanners" in System Preferences, I would see a message in the print queue that the printer was not connected, even though it was listed. Deleting the printer and adding it back would fix the problem—temporarily. As time went on, the problem got worse: Whenever I tried to print from an app—be it Adobe Acrobat, Mail, Notes or Word—it would abruptly crash.

I tried rebooting my iMac and making sure OS X and the print drivers were updated. The apps continued to crash when I hit the print button.

Next I looked in vain for solutions to the problem on the Support section of Apple.com. Then I chatted with an Apple geek on Apple.com. What he suggested that I do did not fix the problem. Not wanting to lug my 27-inch iMac into the Genius Bar at the Apple Store, I resorted to a work-around by sending documents from my iMac to my iPad and then printing them.

Needless to say, I paid close attention when Ryan reviewed the functions of "Printers & Scanners" in System Preferences. My ears perked up when he showed how to reset the printing system by right clicking on the list of Printers in the dialog box.

As soon as I got home from the meeting, I opened System Preferences on my iMac, clicked on "Printers and Scanners," reset the printing system and then added my printers by clicking on the "+" sign at the bottom of the printer list. Then I tried printing a Word document to my default printer. I heard the printer start up with a whirring noise and watch it dispense the printed document. My long, frustrating printing problem was solved!

Here is what the Help function in OS X says about resetting the printing system:

If you can't print to your printer and you've tried all other solutions, reset the printing system. This process deletes all printers from your list of printers, deletes information about all completed print jobs, and deletes all printer presets.

Obviously, resetting the printing system is a last resort in troubleshooting printing problems. Perhaps that is why it is hidden behind a right-click in the list of printers in "Printers & Scanners." It worked for me!

# **BOD** Minutes

### January 16, 2016

**Location:** Bellaire Civic Center, 7008 South Rice Avenue, Bellaire, Texas

**Attendees:** Phil Booth, David Jaschke, Clair Jaschke, Jack Adair, Mike Epstein, Ryan Eisworth, Steve Bridgham

**Call to Order:** By President Phil Booth at 11:33 AM following the conclusion of the January Swap Meet.

**General Announcements:** Phil thanked everyone for coming out today.

### **Monthly Reports**

**Secretary - Jack Adair:** The minutes of the December BOD meeting were approved unanimously.

**Treasurer's Report - Clair Jaschke:** Clair reported that our checking account balance as of the end of December was \$2,477.56. Our savings account balance was \$10,002.98, for total cash on hand of \$12,480.54. All bills have been paid and all monies have deposited. Clair also paid the sales tax that is due next week. Clair has downloaded the new version of Account Edge and will be installing such as soon as December is finalized.

**Membership - David Jaschke:** Dave reported that we ended the month of December with 136 members, which down by one from November, and down from 149 members (a difference of 13 members) from December 31, 2014. We had three renewals; two by check and one by KAGI. It was a slow month for renewals.

**Programming Report - Steve Bridgam:** Steve reported that Ryan had sent him a spreadsheet of past topics that represented possible topics for future main presentations. Steve plans to build a spreadsheet for 2016 as well in QuattroPro.

Ryan shared a few suggestions that he had received from the first batch of survey responses he he had received. He has received nine responses thus far.

Phil had a suggestion for the February 20 meeting, courtesy of Joe Muscara. He suggested the possibility of getting someone from Alsoft to promote the latest version of DiskWarrior. Ryan thought it might even be possible to tape such a presentation for use on our Website and/or posting on YouTube, and perhaps even for use by Alsoft. Rusty Little of Alsoft has spoken here several times in the past, most recently in 2005. Steve agreed to contact Rusty about possibly presenting to HAAUG at the February 20 meeting.

Phil talked to the folks at the City of Bellaire and was told that

we had the Civic Center for as long it is remains in operation. The City has not yet decided what to do with the current Civic Center. He said he may or may not do a Photo SIG next month.

HAAUG Electronic Communications Systems - Ryan Eisworth:

Ryan created an account called lists.haaug.org on his Web hosting service. He was considering pointing haaugnet.org to this account as well. He has put this list in Mail Chimp as well. He would like to continue to use Mail Chimp, but it can be very cumbersome to send a message and it would force us to maintain two different data bases of E-mail addresses.

Ryan will look into creating a virtual private server (VPS) to contain our website, E-mail, and mailing lists if we decide to go away from MacHighways. Ryan will have a summary of his findings available by the February meeting.

#### **New Business**

**State Registration:** Phil has not done anything yet with the state registration, but will look into this in the next couple of weeks.

**Wi-Fi Subscription Issue:** We are going to put this on the back burner for now as we have a much improved Wi-Fi connection in the Bellaire Civic Center.

**Main Presentation Workshop:** Phil will send out a proposal for a meeting to discuss main presentations at a time outside the monthly board meeting.

**Membership Survey:** The Board agreed to add a second drawing item for \$20 worth of iTunes gift cards as an incentive for members to fill out the membership survey.
