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Apple Announces New Portables by Ryan Eisworth

As you have no doubt already heard, Apple announced new MacBook Pro computers recently. These new machines feature 6th-generation Intel Core i5 and i7 processors, and models with a discrete graphics processor use the newly-released Radeon Pro 450, 455 and 460 models. Computers come with either 8 GB or 16 GB of RAM and solid state drives that range from 256 GB to 1 TB on the 13-inch models and up to 2 TB on the 15-inch. Apple's updates to their portable computers have been long-awaited by many users, but not everyone has had a positive reaction to the new notebooks.

Apple made a controversial decision to abandon nearly all familiar ports that have graced our notebook and desktop computers for years, opting to include either two or four USB-C ports. These ports are physically different from previous USB ports, but are also much more capable. On the MacBook Pro the USB-C port can carry both Thunderbolt 3 and USB 3.1. It is also used to charge the computer.

Most users will have to purchase dongles to connect existing hardware to the machine. These vary in price depending on their function, but Apple has dropped the price temporarily on dongles until the end of 2016 to help ease the transition for those purchasing the new notebook. Using a dongle, users can adapt the USB-C port to a traditional USB host port, HDMI, Thunderbolt 2, or a variety of other connectors.

The one thing you won't need a dongle to connect to the new MacBook Pro is your headphones. Apple has left the 3.5mm audio out jack on the new machines despite removing it from the latest iPhone 7.

Another point of concern about the new machines is the lack of a 32 GB memory configuration. This is more of a limitation of the current low-power chips that Apple is using in the notebooks than it is their stubborn unwillingness to provide more configurability, and there is a high likelyhood that when Kaby Lake low-power processors are introduced to the MacBook Pro in the future, a 32 GB configuration will be available.

One of the biggest features of the new comptuer is the Touch Bar which comes with all MacBook Pros except the base 13-inch model (which also lacks two USB-C ports versus the higher-end configurations). The Touch Bar is a context-aware multitouch LCD that replaces the upper row of function keys normally found on a MacBook Pro keyboard. The Touch Bar provides another avenue for interacting with the operating system and applications.

Computers equipped with the Touch Bar also include a Touch ID sensor which can be used to unlock the notebook and authenticate Apple Pay transactions.

The base model 13-inch MacBook Pro without the Touch Bar is \$1,499. The higher-end 13-inch configuration with the Touch Bar and four USB-C ports starts at \$1,799. 15-inch configurations start at \$2,399.

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Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Directors September 17, 2016

Location: Bellaire Civic Center, 7008 S. Rice Avenue, Bellaire, Texas

Attendees: Phil Booth, David Jaschke, Clair Jaschke, Jack Adair, Steve Bridgham, Mike Epstein, Mike King

Call to Order: By President Phil Booth at 12:17 PM following the conclusion of the September General Meeting.

Monthly Reports

Secretary - Jack Adair: The minutes of the August 2016 BOD meeting were approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report - Clair Jaschke: Clair reported that our checking account balance as of the end of August 2016 was \$3,461.24. Our savings account balance was \$10,003.64, for total cash on hand of \$13,464.88. All bills have been paid and all monies have been deposited. From July, we have membership dues of \$250 due to us from KAGI less fees. Clair has received a form to fill out to try and get some of that money back. We will likely not see any money of the \$250.00 for this year, and Clair is seeking guidance about how to handle this issue. Phil suggested writing a memo stating the amount of money owed to us by KAGI, and indicating that we would get something back in 2017.

Membership - David Jaschke: Dave reported that we ended the month of August with 133 members, which was the same as July, and down from 141 members (a difference of 8 members) from August 31, 2016. We had six transactions in August, of which one was new and two were lapsed renewals. We had two regular renewals and one two-year renewal. Of those, we had three credit card transactions. Phil asked if we knew the names of the members tied up with the KAGI payments so that they could be credited. Dave indicated that that has been done and that the memberships have been credited.

Programming Report - Steve Bridgham: Phil reported that there is a company called Capital Home Automation that he called, inviting them to come talk to us in October. He will attempt to talk to one of their people again, even maybe doing with a FaceTime if necessary. Phil will

be the producer for the October meeting. Steve reported that Raf Batista (FileMaker) has committed for November, and wanted to know the bullet points that Raf's presentation should contain. The Board discussed this and came up with some verbal suggestions, and Steve agreed to sit with Raf at the next FileMaker meeting to discuss this. Doug Smith is willing to do his typical holiday presentation in December 2016 but is reluctant to commit beyond that. We have our next Swap Meet in January 2017, and Bob LeVitus for February 2017.

HAAUG Electronic Communications Systems - Ryan Eisworth: Ryan was absent this month, and his only report was regarding the FOSS (Freedom Open Source Software) CDs.

New Business

Report on KAGI Closing and Exploring Alternatives: We have no report as to KAGI alternatives at this point.

Meeting Location Info: Phil was told that we cannot count on the Bellaire Civic Center location as a meeting location after December. The City of Bellaire will be voting on November 8 regarding bonds that include facility upgrades. Phil has been talking to his contact with the city and has been told that the Center Point room above the pool center will likely be available. Phil reported that we would certainly need another facility other than the Center Point room for Swap Meets, and that we may not even have access to the Bellaire Civic Center in December due to building that they may have to do. Phil has talked to the city receptionist and has been told that her church, Faith Lutheran, may be able to rent out their fellowship hall. We need to find a place we can rent for a monthly fee of \$200.00 or less, and we need to prepared to do this for at least 12-18 months until we could get back into the current Bellaire Civic Center building. If we do go to a church, we will need to get a Wi-Fi hotspot for Internet access. Also, there will likely be an issue with the November meeting due to an expected City of Bellaire Fun Run the third weekend of November, which is our typical meeting date.

Phil will draft an E-mail to Kevin Browne of the City of Bellaire regarding the rental situation going forward and the potential City of Bellaire Fun Run and copy the board. Clair asked if we would pay rent month-to-month starting in October since both November and December are questionable, and Phil agreed to talk to Kevin about that.
