

At this Swap Meet—just as at the last one—we will have a table set up for member stuff contributed to HAAUG. It will be in the front by the membership table.

Internet 'radio show' covers all things Macintosh

On Wednesdays I huddle around my warm computer and listen to a radio show. The MacShow QuickTime Stream comes over my DSL connection not the air. The MacShow is a five-year venture of Shawn King of British Columbia, Canada. The show can be picked up at 8:00 PM. Houston time and runs two hours.

The show includes regular interviews with recognized Mac movers and shakers, including David Pogue, Chris Bream, Ted Landau, and Bob LeVitus. There is a segment dedicated to Mac gaming that features Peter Cohen of Macgaming.com. This segment discusses news, rumors and mini reviews of Mac Gaming.

The Mac Basic segment caters to "newbees." Shawn has a friend Ron, who just started using a computer. Shawn and Ron discuss the discoveries that Ron has made during the week. The associated chat rooms go a little nuts during this segment, but I try out my tech support knowledge during the basics section, to see if I know the answers.

There is usually an interview with either a hardware or software company representative touting a new product. Sometimes the guest is a mystery and the audience plays "What's my product." The chat rooms make guesses and the first person with the correct

answer usually wins a copy of the software or hardware item.

As mentioned above there are chat rooms that are associated with the show. I join the World Without Borders Chat room, which is Java based. There is also an IRC Chat room coming from DALNET servers. The chat rooms are an interesting way to interact with the show, by asking questions of the guests. Shawn also takes questions by e-mail.

There are also different give-aways for T-shirts and coffee mugs. Right now the show is giving away passes to MacWorld Expo coming in July. Can't listen on Wednesday? No prob-

lem. The most recent shows are archived for either downloading or streaming so you can listen when you want. All it takes to listen is QuickTime 4 player. I connect using DSL, so most of the time the connection is very good. There are some gurgles and drops during the stream. If you listen on a 56K or slower modem, it might sound a little tinny.

To find the show go to www.themacshowlive.com Wednesdays and click on the listen now button. The show is a QuickTime stream so you need to have the latest version of QuickTime on your machine, and it also needs to be setup as one of your browser's plug-ins

So if you want to catch up on the Mac world, and have a good time tune in to the Mac Show.



Apple to demo iMovie, Final Cut Pro at Aug. 19 meeting

Apple will demo iMovie and Final Cut Pro software at HAAUG's August general meeting as part of its Apple Solution Experts User Group Tour. It is also hoped they'll have other nifty stuff to discuss in the wake of Apple's new product announcements at MacWorld in July.

According to a press release from Apple, the "Apple Solution Experts program connects you to Apple resources. It's your direct line to the kind of information and support that's vital to building a strong, prosperous

business. As part of the tour agenda, we will discuss the Apple Solution Experts program, including its features and benefits, and even bring in a current ASE program member to discuss how the program has helped his or her business and career development."

The Apple tour is also making stops in Austin, New Orleans and several other cities in Apple's South Central Region.

The press release further states: "Now making digital movies is as

easy as using your iMac. Let us show you what you can create with iMovie software and a digital camera. For the more advanced user, combine the Power Mac G4 or even the PowerBook G3 with a DV camcorder and Final Cut Pro software, and you have the first pro-quality desktop movie studio. On this stop in our User Group Tour, we will cover the basics of what you need to know to get started making movies using either iMovie or Final Cut Pro."

The August meeting is on the 19th.

50 megs of free online backup

Sign up for 50 megabytes of free backup space at <http://www.freedrive.com>. All it takes is an e-mail account to sign up for 50 meg of password-protected space on a remote hard drive. Now, 50 megs isn't much to speak of, but it does offer a few advantages. For example, you can make it accessible to others to circumvent file attachment limits. Upload your 12 meg file to the backup, then alert your friend, who can download it. That's one way around a 3-megabyte e-mail attachment size limit.

User group discount for Adobe Magazine

A user group member discount is available for subscriptions to *Adobe Magazine*. Anyone who uses Adobe software—and admit it, that's most of you—could benefit from a subscription to *Adobe Magazine*, which offers tips and solutions for FrameMaker, GoLive, InDesign, Illustrator, PageMaker, PhotoShop and virtually every Adobe package. A one year subscription (six issues, one every two months) is \$9.95 or \$19.90 for two years (nearly 50% off). The subscription order form is available in the News folder on HAAUG Heaven. Corel abandons WordPerfect for Mac

According to the August issue of *MacWorld*, Corel will no longer develop WordPerfect for the Mac. “Instead,” wrote *MacWorld*, “the company will put its Mac resources into graphics programs (including CorelDraw) and the products it recently bought from MetaCreations—Painter, Bryce, Kai's Power Tools, and KPT Vector Effects. Corel last updated WordPerfect in 1996.” WordPerfect 3.5.3 is available as a free download at http://www.corel.com/products/macintosh/wpmac35/pack_freedownload.htm. The free downloadable version doesn't include fonts and graphics, but it is a full-featured, fast-loading word processing package.

What's up with 'MM' fonts and Acrobat Reader snafu

Dear Editor:

I was glad to see the recent article on PDF files. It gives me an opportunity to ask a question. When I receive a PDF file—usually in the form of an e-mail attachment—upon attempting to open the attachment, I receive the message, “Adobe Serif MM Adobe Sans MM must be installed. Please install both fonts.” I don't recall seeing anything in the article about these two fonts. When I am in the middle of a project, I am not inclined to go searching for fonts. Consequently, I have been unable to read PDF attachments. I would appreciate seeing a followup on the PDF article.

Editor's Response: Adobe Serif MM and Sans MM are the Multiple Master fonts used by Acrobat Reader to render fonts not embedded in the PDF document or installed on your computer. For example, let's say someone sends you a PDF generated from a PageMaker document that uses Gill Sans Condensed, but does not embed that font when creating the PDF version. When you try to open it on your Mac, Acrobat first checks to see if you have Gill Sans Condensed installed. If you don't, it relies on the Multiple Master fonts to create a facsimile of that font. “MM” fonts allow Acrobat to “fake it” with fonts you don't have installed on your computer. Acrobat Reader 4 may include the Multiple Master fonts or not require them like Version 3 does. I know they're included with Adobe Type Manager (ATM), which needs them to work properly. Once you track them down—either with software you already own or on Adobe's website—install them and forget they're there. That should solve your PDF problem.







Please provide your name, member


number, expiration date, phone number, so it can be confirmed with your table number.
