

Green Apple Tip of the Month

Shortcuts

When using a computer for the first time, the number of keyboard shortcut commands can be bewildering. Keep it simple. Learn a few at a time. The most used shortcuts are copy, cut and paste. Learn these to save you lots of time instead of selecting these items on the menu. You can view these shortcuts printed as command-C, command-X, command-V in reference books. To see these and other keyboard shortcuts click on the appropriate menu, such as "Edit", and make a note of the items that have keyboard shortcuts which are to the right of the command. See *Figure 1*, find the Cut, Copy and Paste commands. In the side figure, the up arrow stands for the shift key.



I am very lucky to have the week between Christmas and New Years off so this was my week to back up and perform disk maintenance. First you have heard this before: "There are two kinds of Mac users, those who have lost data and those who will." Bob LeVitus I have to say that I am of the later group. I have been lucky that I have not had catastrophic disc failure in the four Macintosh computers I have owned. But this does not mean that it will not happen in the future.

A few issues back I wrote about preparing your computers for weather disasters. This article is about more preparations for data loss. As stated above I had time on my hands so it was time for a major back up and disk maintenance effort. When Prosoft Engineering presented to HAAUG I purchased their Back-up Software, and decided to make a better effort a backing up my data. I also had a spare hard drive (Firewire) that I could back up to. I have used Retrospect what many feel is the gold standard software for backing up, but decided to give Data Backup a try. The software is easy to use, you make choices about what you want to back up and where you want to put the data and hit the start button. It also has a scheduling feature but I have not explored that yet.

My tower was the first machine to get the treatment. I backup my user folder on this machine figuring that I can re-install the OS and applications from my file CDs/DVDs. The process was boring but simple. Tell the software what directory to copy and where to put it and push go, wait 15, 20 minutes and it was done. I also then made a copy of my documents folder on DVD and put it in my safety deposit box. I try to do this once a month, and I emphasize try. This is a case of do as I say not as I do. This gives me the added comfort of having the data someplace other than the house.

Following the backup treatment it was time for disk maintenance. Time to run Disc Warrior. Many months have passed since I ran DW against my tower's hard drive. As you know Disc Warrior does one thing, rebuilds the hard drive's directory. I have no idea if you need to run DW on a periodic basis but I decided that it was a good time to do the maintenance. After DW rebuilt the disk's directory my machine seemed to work a little faster. So maybe it did some good.

Question how do you back up a second computer with one license of the backup software. It is easy if your second computer can be booted in to "Target Disk Mode." Recent Macs allow you turn your computer into a glorified Firewire disk drive, by holding down the "T" key while restarting. When it finishes you get a dancing Firewire logo on your screen. You connect the computers by Firewire and your second machine is a drive on the first machine. Use the backup software on the first machine to backup the drive to another disk. I made 2 partitions on my backup drive one for the main machine and one for my power book. What you back up to is as varied as your needs. My main backup goes on a hard drive in Firewire enclosure, but I also burn certain files on to CD/DVD that I can put up in my bank vault. The hard Drive is available if there is some sort of failure with the disk in either the tower or my PowerBook. The DVD that is in the vault is available in case something happens to the house. You need to determine what will work for you. Several manufacturers make Firewire/USB hard drives that come with software that with the touch of a button will back up your files.

Backup software can be both commercial and share ware, here are a few of the most popular titles.

The "Pig-Pin"

Down and dirty how-to's • By Phil Booth




Here is the setup, your family, or office group need T-shirts for a function. You either were assigned or volunteered to design the shirts. The event is next week and you don't have time to find a shop to do the job. What to do? With your computer, ink-jet printer, some T-shirt transfer material you can make the shirts yourself.

The first thing you will need is a design, Photoshop, or Elements, or Illustrator, or any graphics program that will allow you to layout a design is all you need. I will leave that up to you. But you will need to decide if you want a design that covers the whole shirt or just the left or right breast of the shirt. Size your design to fit the area you will use. If you are using a design that takes up a quarter of a page, clone it and put four on the page, the material is not cheap.

Ok, the design is finished and everyone has signed off on it. What is next? Purchase some ink-jet T-shirt transfer material. I use Avery 3275, which comes in a package of 12 sheets. It will run you about \$15.00 at an office super store. The material is for Light colored material i.e. white T-shirts. Avery makes transfer material that will work on a darker color but you may need to order that off of their web site as I have not seen it in local stores.

The design needs to be turned into a mirror image. The graphics program you use to generate the design should be able to convert the image to a mirror. You should experiment with plain paper before you commit to the transfer media. I found out to my surprise, that the Canon printer driver for the I860 printer will print the image as a mirror when you select T-shirt transfer.

The transfer material is a clear plastic material that is bonded to a paper carrier. The design is printed on the coated side in reverse and then ironed on to the shirt. The heat from a iron melts an adhesive layer and after cooling the paper carrier is removed leaving the design on the shirt. Depending on how you cut your design from the sheet there will be clear border around the design. You need allow the transfer to cool before you remove the backing paper. Gently remove the backing paper, and admire your handy work.
