SIG's start at 9am and the main meeting begins at 11:15. See you there!





Welcome to the September issue of the Apple Barrel! I hope that this issue finds everyone enjoying the cool (if wet) weather; this is much more like home for me so I'm soaking it up as much as possible. This city never seems to slow down much, and neither has Apple. September's not yet halfover and there is lots of news from Cupertino:

Dear HAAUG,

Mac OS X 10.6 Snow Leopard

Apple released Snow Leopard on August 28, ahead of an expected September release. This new version costs \$29 and is a "under-the-hood" update to Mac OS X, providing more updates to the underlying code and structure of OS X than major changes to the interface and daily usage. OS X 10.6.1 was subsequently released on September 10 and contains some minor upgrades to the software. Dreux Ste. Marie from Apple will be talking in-depth about what's new in Snow Leopard, so be sure not to miss our September meeting on the 19th.

Updated iPods

Apple announced updates to the entire iPod family on September 8 at a special press event in San Francisco. Ready for the upcoming holiday season, the updated lines include additional colors, increased storage and lower prices depending on the model. We cover the updates in depth on Page 4.

iTunes 9

At the September 8 iPod event, iTunes 9 was also announced. In addition to a revamped iTunes Store, the application itself gets some visual updates and a smart new feature called Home Sharing, which to me looks like Shared Libraries on steroids. With this feature, you can automatically sync songs between multiple computers in the same household. This is great for me: I have an iMac that I use as my primary Mac, and a MacBook that I take on the road. By syncing exactly what songs I want to the MacBook, I can keep it up to date and not have to worry about streaming songs using Shared Libraries or playing songs in the Finder though a connection to the iMac. From what I can read, this only works on a local network, so you won't be able to use it between computers at work and home.

New Version of Final Cut Studio and Logic Studio

For the professional A/V production crowd, Apple announce new versions of Final Cut Studio and Logic Studio, which are Apple's Pro video and audio production suites, respectively. Final Cut Studio is available for \$999 and Logic Studio for \$499. These suites are above the level that most HAAUG members need, but we did receive some feedback from the membership survey indicating an interest in hosting a pro A/V SIG. If you have experience in the field, please let us know!

As always, thank you to everyone who volunteers their time and energy to help make HAAUG successful. It's because of your hard work that everyone can enjoy the benefits of the group. With that said, our volunteers are always glad to have other members help in the planning, setup and support of the group's events. We have board positions open that need to be filled, and are looking for HAAUG members who are willing to donate a small amount of time to help make everything happen. If you're interested, please let us know!


Dictionary.com (*Dictionary.com*): I have found this App, which is both a dictionary and a thesaurus, to be an invaluable companion. I can easily find the meaning of a new

word in seconds. This is one of several dictionary Apps in the Apps Store.




include maps and directions. These are just two of several Yellow Page and White Page apps in the Apps Store.

OpenTable (OpenTable, Inc.). If you've discovered OpenTable online, you know it's an easy and fast way to make a restaurant reservation in most large cities in the U.S. and overseas. The OpenTable App covers restaurants in the U.S., Canada and the U.K. With this App, gone are the days of calling a restaurant for a reservation and being put on hold, only to learn that no tables are




a that no tables are available when you wish to dine. OpenTable members earn points towards free meals at OpenTable restaurants, can read reviews of restaurants by other OpenTable members, and view restaurant menus via the Web.

First, check the General tab on the Security System Preferences panel to ensure that the Require password [some period] after sleep or screen saver begins box is checked.

Then, open Automator in the Applications folder, and select Service from the screen that appears. At the top of the new Service's actions, in the Service receives drop-down, select no input from the options. Make sure that any application is selected in the second drop-down

Add the Start Screensaver action (in the Utilities group of actions) to the Service by dragging it to the right. Save the Service (Automator does not ask you where to save it, just to name it). Next, open System Preferences and select the Keyboard preference pane. Select the Keyboard Shortcuts tab at the top, then the Services group on the left. The service you created should be near the bottom of the list of Services under the General disclosure triangle.

QuickTip

A little-known feature of the iPhone is its ability to display subtitles on movies. To do this, you just need the free programs

MKVtools, SubCleaner, and Subler, and a conversion program -- I recommend FilmRedux. Once those are installed on your Mac, do this:

- 1.) Convert the file to a raw, un-subtitled .mp4 with FilmRedux
- 2.) Extract the UTF8 subtitle file (.srt) from the original file with MKVtools.
- 3.) Clean up the .srt with SubCleaner
- 4.) Merge the .mp4 and the .srt together in Subler

Then sync the movie over to your iPhone. Next to the rewind button, a new subtitle button will appear.




Utilities

Many of us have social networking sites such as Facebook, MySpace, or LinkedIn; what do you want your family to do with theses sites, if you die? Delete the site? Turn it in to a permanent memorial? You need to make these plans ahead of time. Check with the services to see their policies and what documentation will be required to gain access to these sites. You need a plan and a method for family members to gain access to the web resources that you own.

I really don't have any suggestions about this other than you need to think about these matters. I am using 1Password (http://agilewebsolutions.com/products/1Password; @1password), a password utility that holds my web log-ins and will automatically will fill in the log-in information using just one password. Putting that password in a safety deposit box will allow my agents access to the accounts. I may check with an attorney do see if I need to grant a formal digital power of attorney. I will need to leave instructions about how to dispose of my digital presence on the Internet.

QuickTip

One of the new features in Snow Leopard is that



you can set a delay before the password is activated for your screensaver/wake from sleep. This is helpful because I had my password disabled previously, since I didn't want to enter it in all the time. However, the only options for the delay are: Immediately, 5 Seconds, 1 Minute, 5 Minutes, 15 Minutes, 1 Hour, 4 Hours.

For me, 15 minutes is too short and 1 hour is too long: I want 30 minutes. Fortunately, there is a way around this -- a simple Terminal command. The Terminal command is:

defaults -currentHost write com.apple.screensaver askForPasswordDelay int 1800

To set it to however long you like, edit the last item (1800) which is 30 minutes * 60 seconds/minute) to the desired delay in seconds. Copy and paste the command into Terminal, change the time limit, and hit Return. Now, all you have to do is log out and back in again and you're good to go!

Updated iPods Announced

QuickTip

I run iTunes from a server tucked away at the back of a closet, streaming to Airtunes speakers, and I use iPhone's Remote software to control everything. I love it, except: There's no obvious way to control iTunes radio streams from Remote. So when I want to listen to the radio (say, every single morning to hear NPR news), I have to climb into the closet and launch it from iTunes there.

My solution: Create a playlist in iTunes for the radio stream(s) I listen to regularly. Then they show up as playlists in Remote on the iPhone.

http:// www.macosxhints.com/ article.php? story=20090814113933554 On Wednesday, September 9th Apple held a special event in San Francisco where they unveiled the latest round of iPods and iPod touches in preparation for the upcoming holiday season. Every iPod model was affected, though some just in price. Here's the breakdown:

iPod classic: This stalwart model received a memory bump on the high-end model from 120GB to 160GB, a 33% increase. The price remains at \$249. This is the only size offered, and is available in either black or silver.

iPod shuffle: Apple's buttonless iPod got new color options of pink, green and blue that match the colors already found on the iPod nano line, in addition to the existing black and silver

options. The price also dropped on the shuffle; the 2GB model is available for \$59 and the 4GB for \$79. In addition, Apple is offering a "special edition" 4GB model in polished stainless steel for \$99. (For all the metallurgy geeks out there – any bets on what grade of stainless steel Apple chose?)

iPod nano: The nano received the most upgrades this time around, and will likely be the must-have iPod for this holiday season. The new nanos now offer a video camera for recording 640x480 video (although no still pictures); an FM radio with 15-minute live pausing; VoiceOver support that originally appeared in the shuffle; and a new Genius Mix feature similar to what we saw first in iTunes 8. The Genius Mix lets you create "smart" playlists on the



fly either with or without selecting a starter song for the iPod to base its playlist on. A microphone and speaker are now present on the nano (for the video camera) and even a pedometer. The nano is available in nine different colors (see seven of them above), and will set you back \$149 for the 8GB model or \$179 for the 16GB.

iPod touch: Not to be forgotten, the iPod touch received both a price drop and memory bump, but not a video camera as was heavily anticipated (reports indicate they may have had hardware issues). These are now available in 8GB (\$199), 32GB (\$299) and 64GB (\$399); the latter two models have upgraded hardware and will run OpenGL ES 2.0, an improved graphics library for faster, smoother game and application performance.





If you hold down the Command or Shift key while in the Applications tab for your iPhone/iPod touch in you can choose multi applications at the sa




iPhone/iPod touch in iTunes 9, you can choose multiple applications at the same time, then slide them over to a new screen on the iPhone/Touch. Finally an easier way to move multiple apps!

Minor GUI nitpick: the Shift key should allow a whole row or selection to be chosen in a contiguous manner, while the Command key should allow for non-contiguous selections. This would make the behavior consistent with the Finder.

[robg adds: Don't overlook the ability to drag entire pages, too, as noted in the short note on that screen. If folders get added in OS3.2/iTunes 9.1, app management will (finally) be basically perfect for my needs.]





After discussing **HAAUG Web Hosting Committee Report:** Matt the issue of who would lead the SIG, the board decided reported that the committee, consisting of David to change the name of the iTunes SIG to the iLife SIG and to rotate leaders of the SIG according to the particular iLife software program being discussed at the SIG. Rick suggested that interest in iMovie might increase as a result of the video capture feature on the new iPhone.

Booth reported that HAAUG has paid for the use of the **August Main Presentation Topic:** The board decided to hold a panel discussion on email issues as the Main Presentation for the August General Meeting. Phil Booth suggested contacting Smile on My Mac, a past MacFest sponsor, for a possible future presentation of some of its software programs via iChat.

New Business:

Jaschke, Matt Willmore and Greg Wright, looked at several web hosts and considered factors such as price, storage, band width, and type of server. The committee recommended that HAAUG select MacHighway for web hosting services. MacHighway's large plan, which costs \$14.95 per month, would provide, at a small fraction of what IAPC is charging HAAUG each month, the same web hosting services that IAPC is currently providing,

except for hosting of the FileMaker database and the HAAUG Hotline. The committee recommended that Jeff Davis host the FileMaker database. An 800 number service or a service such as Google Voice (which is currently in beta development) could handle the HAAUG Hotline. If either service is chosen for the HAAUG Hotline, HAAUG would lose its listing in the Yellow Pages. The board discussed the limited usage the HAAUG Hotline is getting. HAAUG members who have dial-up or DSL service through HAAUG will remain with IAPC. The board will meet during the August General Meeting to act upon the committee's recommendation.


