Come on down, and check out some of the best deals in town!


We will be holding the first meeting of the 2015 Board of Directors after the Swap Meet, so be sure and be there!

Notes from the Last Meeting

Highlights from December, 2014

Last month we had Lee Hutchinson from Ars Technica present on “Cool Stuff You Can Do with OS X Terminal.” This was a fun and informative interactive meeting that we hope you all were able to attend. If you weren’t able to attend or you missed anything during the meeting, here are some highlights from Lee’s presentation.

Terminal.app is a window into the UNIX underpinnings of Mac OS X. It is located in the Utilities folder inside the Applications folder. You can get to the Utilities folder from Finder’s “Go” menu and launch Terminal from there, or you can type “Terminal” into Spotlight’s search field and press Return.

You can customize the appearance of Terminal by choosing *Preferences...* from the *Terminal* menu. The *Profiles* pane has a selection of visual styles. Select the one you prefer and click the “Default” button to make it the default profile. When you launch a new Terminal window, the profile you selected will be used.

Some of the Terminal commands Lee covered included the following (usage examples shown below each command):

`whoami` - shows the logged in user’s UNIX username

```
$ whoami  
ryan42
```

`hostname` - shows your computer’s hostname, which identifies it on the network

```
$ hostname  
RyanAir
```

`uptime` - shows how long the computer has been booted

```
$ uptime  
0:09 up 25 days, 14:08, 6 users, load averages: 0.83 1.06 1.09
```

`say` - an interface into the Mac’s text-to-speech engine, the `say` command lets you make your Mac talk!

```
$ say "Isn't it nice to have a computer that will talk to you?"
```

`man` - shows the manual entry for a program

```
$ man say
```

To exit the man page entry and return to the Terminal prompt, type the letter `q`.

`killall` - kills all processes matching a given name

```
$ killall Finder
```

The name of the processes is case-sensitive, so “finder” will not work here.

`history` - shows previously entered Terminal commands. Each line is numbered. Commands can be run again by typing the exclamation mark followed by the number for the desired command and pressing Return.

```
$ history  
1  whoami  
2  hostname  
3  uptime  
$ !2  
hostname  
RyanAir
```

HAAUG Board of Directors Meeting – November 15, 2014

Call to Order: By President Philip Booth at 1:21 PM following the conclusion of the November General Meeting.

General Announcements: Phil thanked Dave for coming out to finish up the setup for the monthly meeting.

2015 Nominations

Nominations for the Board of Directors for calendar year 2015 were opened during the business portion of the General Meeting. There were no nominations from the floor. The following current board members agreed to again be nominated for 2015:

- President: Phil Booth
- Treasurer: Clair Jaschke
- Membership Chairman: David Jaschke
- Electronic Communications: Ryan Eisworth
- Secretary: Jack Adair
- Members At Large: Mike King, Mike Epstein

Greg Wright has indicated his desire to step down from the position of Vice President, Programming. This leaves a vacancy for this very important position.

Monthly Reports

Secretary - Jack Adair: Minutes of the October BOD meeting were approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report - Clair Jaschke: Our checking account balance as of the end of October was \$5,392.00. Our savings account balance was \$10,000.84, for total cash on hand of \$15,392.84. Almost all of the October bills have been paid, but we have yet to receive the post office bill. As of the meeting date, we had not yet received Phil's expenses for the October meeting at the Embassy Suites. As is noted later in these minutes, those expenses were submitted and Phil was reimbursed by check before the meeting adjourned.

Vice President - Greg Wright: Greg submitted a report via E-mail as he was out sick today. His report contained the following:

- He has E-mails out to Dreux St. Marie of Apple, Lee Hutchinson of ARS Technica, and Dave Hamilton of Mac Geek Gab regarding possibly presenting for the December meeting.
- The January Swap Meet is set for January 17. This date needs to be confirmed with the City of Bellaire.
- The annual "State of the Mac" address by Bob LeVitus is set for February 21. Bob has confirmed his availability; we need to confirm the date with the City of Bellaire

Phil indicated that he would try to resurrect the Photo SIG in December.

Membership - David Jaschke: Dave reported that we ended the month of October with 152 members, which is down by one from 153 members from September, and down from 166 members (a difference of 14 members) from October 31, 2013. We had 7 renewals in October, two of which were by KAGI. There were no credit card transactions. We had two two-year renewals and one lapsed renewal.

HAAUG Electronic Communications Systems - Ryan Eisworth: Ryan reported that the Apple Barrel is now on the Website. No one has seen it yet as no link was posted yet. The Board agreed that we needed to get Ryan some additional information about deadlines, etc. We did mention that a link needed to get sent out for members to access the Apple Barrel early in the week of the meeting. We also need to work with Ryan to get some E-mail issues resolved.

New Business

2014 October Meeting Expenses: The October meeting expenses totaled \$1671.90, against an approved budget of \$1500.00. The Board voted unanimously to cover the total expense as reported by Phil, and he has been reimbursed.

2015 Budget Committee: No budget meeting has yet taken place. The Budget Subcommittee will meet sometime between now and the December general meeting, and will submit the budget electronically to the Board members for their vote, with a plan to submit to the membership at the December General Meeting. Board members need to submit their votes to the Secretary for counting.
