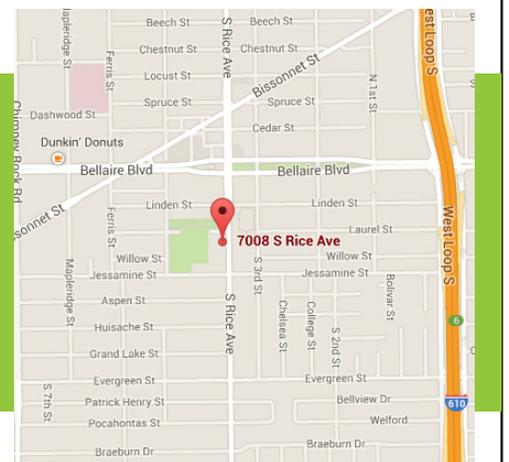
The Apple Watch: What you need to know... Saturday, May 16th

Boss HAAUG Speaks

Monthly Address from the HAAUG President



"The watch is here, the watch is here," to paraphrase the Midnight Ride of Paul Revere. The week I am writing this; the Apple web exploded with stories about the latest Apple product. As I explained last month I do not consider myself a "Watch" person. It is interesting to see the reaction of the tech press to the new device.

With a few gripes about the length of time the watch face remains active the reviews are generally positive. Along with the positive press there are also the sirens of doubt stating that 2.5 million pre-orders is a tepid response to the introduction of the new Apple device. It will be interesting to see how this all plays out.

I would like to thank the other members of the panel, some of whom were recruited the day of the meeting, for playing "What's App Doc." It is interesting to see what folks install on their machines beyond the usual apps. Jack Adair told you about iBank as an alternative to Quicken. David Crook highlighted several utilities that make his computing experience easier. I showed off three applications Cadent WineCellar, Final Draft Screen play writing software, and Video Converter. Having members discuss software or hardware that makes their computing experience better.

Apple again announced their March quarter results. Total revenue was 58 Billion dollars realizing 13.5 Billion dollars in profit. Compared to the same quarter last year total revenue was 45.6 billion. Most of it came from iPhone sales. Don't think that the Mac is an after thought: Apple sold 4.56 million Macintoshes. So again Apple raked in a large sum of money.

Made an appointment with an orthopedist, one of my elbows was painful. The diagnosis was tendentious and since I don't play golf or tennis it looks like my computer use is the cause. I have not had the problems with my hands but this pain is really affecting some of the things that I do. I left the problem go after a few months and that means that it will take longer to resolve. Monthly Reports

Secretary - Jack Adair: Minutes of the February BOD meeting were approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report - Clair Jaschke: Our checking account balance as of the end of February was \$4,157.47. Our savings account balance was \$10,001.82, for total cash on hand of \$14,159.29. Clair has filed our state sales tax for last year and our federal E-file. All of the February bills have been paid and all monies have been deposited.

Programming Report: Mike King reported that Dave Hamilton of MacGeekGab is interested in coming down to Houston in person. We will investigate to see if he is available for April. Ryan mentioned that it would be interesting to see if he could do a show from Houston before or after the meeting, with the idea being that HAAUG could get some better exposure.

Phil reported that we have no backup program for April if Dave Hamilton is not available. Ryan reported that he would be interested in talking about ProSoft Engineering's Data Rescue X software if we needed a program. There is also a possibility of getting Dwight Silverman from the Chronicle as well.

Membership - David Jaschke: Dave reported that we ended the month of February with 150 members, which was the same as January, and down from 164 members (a difference of 14 members) from February 28, 2014. We had fourteen renewals, including one lapsed and two two-year renewals. We had two credit card transactions and one by KAGI.

HAAUG Electronic Communications Systems - Ryan Esworth: The web site is working well. Ryan fixed two broken links on the site this morning. The link that takes you to Café Press, which we use to market stuff with HAAUG logos, does work. There was a concern that that link does not take you to the HAAUG domain, but it is a legitimate operation.

New Business

The April meeting presenter will be either Dave Hamilton or Dwight Silverman. For future topics, Ryan mentioned that the upcoming Office 2016 for Mac would probably be well worth a program. A "Utilities Day" program could be done using DiskWarrior, Tech Tool Pro, Prosoft Data Rescue X, LaunchBar, Drag Thing, and other utilities. If neither the Hamilton or Silverman program idea works out, then another "What's On Our Mac" program will be the backup program for April. Phil agreed to let the board members know about this within the next week or so for planning purposes.

Phil announced that we needed to appoint an Audit Committee. He appointed Mike Epstein, Ryan Esworth, and Mike King for the committee. Clair will bring the materials next month with a plan to do the audit during the morning of the general meeting.

We will have an issue for the May meeting, which is scheduled for date May 16, due to Phil's responsibilities at commencement exercises at UH. Phil will not be available for setup on May 15 or for the Board meeting on May 16. The Board agreed to take care of the specifics for the May meeting at the April board meeting.

Phil also expressed concern about getting a VP of programming. He feels that we are going to run out of programming ideas fairly soon. Everyone needs to think if there are any potential candidates for this role.
